TELEGRAPHIC.

The Indians that had Charles C. ... SAN FRANCISCO, May 19.—A special cable from Chihuahua May 18, says: The news received at military headquarters states that Chato's band of sixty Apaches have entered Chihuahua through the Sierra Madre, going toward Sierra Fuerte. They killed one man at Majueche and one at Ojitas and two of them at San Juan Ventura. All of them are on foot with no squaws or boys. This is the band that had Charles C. Comas who is doubtless killed. The Mexican troops are in hot pursuit.

PANTANO, May 21.—From all that can be learned, the shooting of Thomas Belknap was accidental; he went to Greaterville to pay off some Mexicans, who had been working on his claims. Towards evening, after receiving their money, they set to shooting and drinking. One of the bullets struck the roof of the house and Mr. Belknap went to the door to see what was the matter, when a bullet passed through his lungs, coming out at the spine. He will probably die.

PHOENIX, May 21.—Sixty Indians from the United States en route for the Sierra Madre killed four men. The troops are pursuing them.

Condensed Telegrams. The International Convention of the Young Men's Christian Association, composed of 200 delegates, and the National Brewers' Association are in session at Milwaukee.

Clinton, Ill., has been visited by a cyclone. Southworth, late city treasurer of Philadelphia, is charged with the misappropriation of \$16,875. The farmel fund has reached \$29,000, and an effort will be made to make it reach \$50,000.

The Irish National Land League, at St. Louis, and the Third Ward League of Chicago have denounced the Pope for meddling with political matters. Spectators will not be permitted to use opera glasses at the coronation of the czar, nor to carry any article that may contain dynamite.

A storm at Deadwood, last Friday, killed four people and destroyed \$600,000 worth of property. The recent cyclones in Missouri—two on the same day—did great damage. The upper one began near Kansas City. At Wendover, two women killed and three children wounded; loss to property \$40,000. At Kansas City, 3 killed, 13 wounded, \$200,000 worth of property destroyed.

At Liberty several residences in town and many farm houses blown away. At Missouri City, the steamer Bright Light was blown ashore. At Macon, 3 killed, 3 wounded, and many farm houses destroyed. The other cyclone began at Webb City, a mining town in the southwest corner, where it destroyed two houses. Oregon was almost totally destroyed; 3 killed, 20 wounded. At Cartersville, ten houses blown down. At Brookfield 5 killed, 15 wounded. On Spring river, a child was killed and much property destroyed.

The latter is on the route taken by the cyclone that destroyed Marshfield with heavy loss of life, several years ago, and is also on a line with two subsequent cyclones, one of which destroyed Savoy, Tex., and the other was so severe at McAllister, I. T.

Crook's Complications. EL PASO, TEXAS, May 22.—General Crook advised with the Governor of Sonora and General Topete commanding the forces of that State; also General Terrazas, the Governor of Chihuahua and General Regero, commander of the forces here. It was explained that no permission to make a campaign on Mexican soil could be accorded as it would be against international law.

News of the Week

Fire in Albuquerque. ALBUQUERQUE, May 21. A fire to-night caught in the store of D. Goldberg, pawnbroker, a frame building on Broadway avenue, between Second and Third street at 8-15 o'clock. It being Saturday night and so early a crowd of people were on the streets, when the fire broke out were speedily brought to the scene of danger. The flames had acquired some headway before the volunteers got to work with buckets, and it soon extended to the adjoining frame building owned by J. Sharick, the lower floor occupied by him as a jewelry store and the upper floors as lodging-rooms. The total damage to houses and stock is estimated at about \$2,500, though this is probably somewhat over the correct figures.

Railroad Meeting To-night. The railroad meeting to-night is the most important matter respecting the building of a road to Phoenix. Indeed it is to conclude whether we are to have a road built in the west or not. The Tucson people wish to know what we mean to do, so they can act accordingly. The subject of ways and means will therefore occupy the attention of the meeting, where the money is to come from will be considered. The cost of the road is the first item to be considered, then how the money is to be raised. Unless our people take hold of the matter with energy, we see no chance for the building of the road in contemplation; and if they do, we fear the cost will be more than the people of the three counties through which it will pass can stand up under.

Railroad Meeting. The railroad meeting convened last evening at the call of the chairman of the previous meeting. The meeting was called to order by Mr. J. M. Ellis, Mayor Porter was called on to preside and N. A. Morford to act as secretary.

The will of the meeting being called for by Mr. J. M. Ellis, made a few pointed remarks to the effect that after due deliberation on the subject and that he considered the endeavors of the citizens of the valley co-act in theory in attempting to gain an outlet for their produce whereby they could compete with California, nevertheless, he thought, the valley should maintain friendly relations with the Southern Pacific Railroad Company for the reason that it is within their power even when we have an independent line to Tucson and the south to make their rates such from California that competition in those markets will be impossible. He thought it better to ask the assistance of the Southern Pacific people in building the road coupled with such concessions from them as will ease us rates that will place us in the southern markets ahead of southern California. Should the Southern Pacific refuse to assist us in any way it would be left to us to oppose it.

Mr. Ganz thought that he had been subject to the Southern Pacific people long enough and that if we were determined and would go ahead with the assistance of Pinal and Pinal we could build the road and successfully compete with the Southern Pacific.

Hon. A. C. Baker after a brief resume of what previous meetings had done towards getting things in shape read letters from Mr. Watkins of Tucson to the effect that the leading citizens of Tucson wished to visit us. Mr. Baker then moved that the chair appoint a committee to invite the Tucson people to visit us and the Mayor of the city to be its chairman. The chair appointed as such committee the members of the town Council composed of the Hon. S. Mayor, DeForest Porter, J. Y. T. Smith, M. Kales, W. F. McNulty, G. H. N. Lira and in addition Hon. A. C. Baker, Capt. W. A. Hancock and E. Ganz. This committee was subsequently made a committee on entertainment also.

On motion of Mr. Ganz a committee on finances was appointed for the purpose of raising funds for the entertainment of visitors. The motion prevailed and the committee was named as follows: E. Ganz, A. C. Baker, Capt. Hancock, J. Y. T. Smith, M. Kales, W. F. McNulty and Judge J. H. Cox.

The chairman of the meeting, Hon. DeForest Porter called Capt. Hancock to the chair and in substance said that after all these years when the leading citizens of our sister city had at length expressed themselves as desiring of making us a visit it would be a great pleasure to us to entertain them. He said that even though the visit might not result in a railroad it would be a great benefit to our valley to have these visitors examine its resources, for he was sure the people of other portions of the Territory understood very little of its importance.

He thought that which would entertain most would be the individual courtesies which we might extend to them individually and that for the purposes of entertaining our visitors the people of the town and valley should consider themselves a committee of the whole.

A motion then prevailed to adjourn subject to the call of the chair.
