RAILROAD PROGRESS.

Mr. Everts.—The opening of this subject in your last paper, gives an opportunity to extend a view in another direction, where seems to lie a still more natural and reliable resource for the Western Vermont Railroad. That road follows a valley parallel with the Green Mountains to the neighborhood of Bennington, where it inclines more toward the Hudson River, the original point of destination in view. It connects with the Troy & Boston Railroad near Hoosic Falls and terminates in that road at Eagle Bridge. At Hoosic Junction passengers may wait for a train to North Adams, the present eastern terminus of the Troy & Boston. The Bennington Branch leaves at North Bennington. The extension of this to North Adams would afford a shorter, independent route, and there a line of connection is open to the Vermont road, which might be exclusively its own, and with no further increased outlay, would afford permanent and increasing resources of business for its enterprise.

Nonah Webster, L. L. D., devoted a long life to study of language, and the making of books. Errors and defects in pronunciation have been rectified, and Mr. Webster's peculiarities in orthography, if not entirely discarded, have been rendered less harmful by giving not only his mode of spelling, but also that most in use by good writers and publishers both in this country and England, indicating a preference for the former, as we suppose, by giving it the first place.
