Governor Brownlow's Message.

To the Editor of the Nashville Union: Will you allow an old contributor to submit to you a few lines...

Some of the editorial comments on the editorial content which is so recently added, to resume his pen. While I have seen no reason to change my position...

In my power, modify any expressions of harshness, or apparent bitterness, I ever wrote. But for this I should be tempted to write hard things in reference to the conduct of the new man in power in Tennessee.

This remark was suggested by reading the message of Gov. Brownlow to the Legislature delivered the other day. It was my fate to be opposed to the administration of John G. Harris in 1861. I thought of many of his new and arbitrary and in disregard of public opinion. But no official act of his, in defiance of public opinion, and in violation of the principles of republicanism, and government the almost daily official denunciations and acts of the present Governor of Tennessee.

In regard to the Congressional election last summer, without the shadow of a title of authority of law, and in direct violation of law, he set aside the votes of twenty-one counties. Then, when in obedience to the constitution, the people elected a new Legislature, he refused to let them sit, in violation of law, to issue the commission, which in effect told the people if they did not vote as directed, they would be re-elected to a military government. And now, in the message before me, he advises and treats the Legislature as a body of traitors, which he says were elected by large majorities. If I condemned the comparative-ly small usurpations of Harris, in 1861, how could I avoid condemning the much more glaring ones of Brownlow, in 1862? Was it any worse to rebel in 1861, than it is to be a greater one in 1862? What can be greater rebellion against the peace and order of society than to be a constant and open violation of law? Such a rebel, on a large scale as he can be, is Brownlow, in the year of grace, unfortunately for the interests of peace and order in Tennessee.

Brownlow talks in this last message about certain rebels breaking up the State government. God knows, if I were a rebel, I would break up the State government, and I would break up the State government, and I would break up the State government.
