Each House shall be the judge of the elections, returns and qualifications of its own members, and its power of impeachment, except that no judicial or political officer shall be removed from office by either House, unless by a two-thirds vote.

Each House shall have the power to try all impeachments, and no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Each House shall have the power to punish its members for disorderly conduct, and, with the concurrence of two-thirds of its members, to expel a member.

Each House shall have the power to adjourn, and to determine the rules of its proceedings, and to punish its members for disorderly conduct.

Each House shall have the power to originate bills for raising revenue, and no bill for that purpose shall originate in the Senate, but the Senate may propose amendments.

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CONSTITUTION.

Confederate States of America. We, the people of the Confederate States, each State acting in its sovereign and independent character, in order to form a more perfect Union, to establish justice, to insure domestic tranquility, and secure the blessings of liberty to ourselves and our posterity, do hereby ordain and establish this Constitution for the Confederate States of America.

ARTICLE I. SECTION 1. All legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the Confederate States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

SECTION 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several States, and the electors in each State shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the State Legislature.

SECTION 3. The Senate of the Confederate States shall be composed of two Senators from each State, chosen for six years, and each Senator shall have the qualifications requisite for electors of the most numerous branch of the State Legislature.

SECTION 4. The House of Representatives shall choose their Speaker and other officers, and shall have the sole power of impeachment, except that no judicial or political officer shall be removed from office by either House, unless by a two-thirds vote.

SECTION 5. The Senate shall have the power to try all impeachments, and no person shall be convicted without the concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

SECTION 6. Each House shall have the power to punish its members for disorderly conduct, and, with the concurrence of two-thirds of its members, to expel a member.

SECTION 7. Each House shall have the power to adjourn, and to determine the rules of its proceedings, and to punish its members for disorderly conduct.

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ARTICLE II.

SECTION 1. The Executive power shall be vested in a President of the Confederate States, who shall hold his office for four years, and shall be elected by the electors in each State.

SECTION 2. The President shall have the power to grant reprieves and pardons, except in cases of impeachment.

SECTION 3. The President shall have the power to nominate and to appoint, and to receive and to commission, all officers and all judges of the Confederate States, who shall hold their offices during the term of years specified in their respective constitutions.

SECTION 4. The President shall have the power to propose, and to appoint and to remove, all officers and all judges of the Confederate States, who shall hold their offices during the term of years specified in their respective constitutions.

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ARTICLE III.

SECTION 1. The judicial power shall be vested in one Supreme Court, and in such inferior Courts as the Congress may, from time to time, ordain and establish.

SECTION 2. The Supreme Court shall have the power to hear and to determine, with such exceptions and regulations as the Congress may, all cases arising under this Constitution, under the laws of the Confederate States, and under all treaties, agreements, and consular consorts, which shall be made by the Confederate States.

SECTION 3.
