CONVENTION TO-DAY.

THE PRELIMINARY PROCEEDINGS.

What Was Said and Done in the Roberts and Anti-Roberts Caucuses - A Roberts Ticket Agreed Upon - The Crowd, Decorations, Etc.

Dallas presented a gay scene last night. The business houses in the center were brilliantly illuminated and decorated with flags and bunting. The streets swarmed with delegates to the convention, politicians and visitors, all of whom were alive to the question of the hour, the nomination of candidates on the Democratic ticket for the state offices.

The anti-Roberts and Roberts men each held a caucus, and both meetings were enthusiastic and largely attended.

The trains arriving last night brought in delegations from a large number of counties, and also a great many visitors to the convention. The streets, depots and hotels were scenes of bustle and activity, the delegates being looked after and taken in charge by the active, wide-awake men of the respective sides. The Wood county delegation came in headed and heralded by the Mincola coronet band.

ANTI-ROBERTS CAUCUS.

At 2 o'clock yesterday afternoon the anti-Roberts men, to the number of over one hundred, met at the court house. Judge Barkisale called the meeting to order, and moved that Hon. Charles Stewart, of Harris county, be made chairman of the caucus. This motion prevailed unanimously. Mr. Stewart on taking the chair submitted a few remarks, stating the object of the meeting and the necessity of activity on the part of all opposed to the re-nomination of Governor Roberts.

On motion, Mr. Charles L. Martin of the Herald editorial staff, was made secretary of the caucus. Judge Barkisale then moved, and the motion prevailed, that every gentleman in the room who was not an anti-Roberts man be requested to leave the caucus. A few gentlemen then retired. At the suggestion of Judge Barkisale, Marshal W. F. Morton was appointed by the chair to act as sergeant-at-arms, with instructions to admit no one who was not opposed to the re-nomination of Governor O. M. Roberts.

Judge Barkisale then moved that no newspaper reporter be permitted to remain in the caucus unless he consented to publish none of the proceedings had without first submitting his report to a committee appointed to supervise it, and empowered to strike what in its opinion should be kept from the public.

Judge Silas Hare offered as an amendment to this motion, that a committee of three be appointed by the chair to whom delegates present should report the sentiment of their respective delegations on the call of the roll of the counties.

This motion and amendment occasioned considerable discussion, participated in by Judge Hare, of Grayson; Judge Barkisale, of Dallas; Major J. H. Littlefield, of Hill; Mr. Moran, of Parker; Mr. Parsons, of Kaufman; Judge Alexander White, of Dallas, and Colonel W. C. Holland, of Dallas; all of whom spoke, not only in regard to the motion, but submitting remarks in the interest of activity and vigilance in the fight to secure the defeat of Governor Roberts.

The question on the amendment being put to the caucus, it prevailed by a large majority. The chair then appointed on motion of Moran, of Parker, that he appoint the committee, Messrs. Moran, of Parker, Leonard, of Dallas, and Holland, of Dallas.

The roll of counties was then called by the secretary and quite a number responded, the delegates present reporting the complexion of their delegations to the committee.

Judge Hare moved, after the committee reported that it had pushed its work, that every Democrat present, whether a delegate or not, be requested to act as a committee of one to inform delegates as fast as they arrived in the city, the time and place when and where the caucus would next meet, and the motion was carried unanimously.

Judge Barkisale then moved that the caucus adjourn to meet at ten o'clock to day. Mr. Parsons, of Kaufman, offered an amendment that the caucus meet that night at 8:30, which prevailed.

NIGHT SESSION.

The caucus met at its headquarters at half past eight last night, Mr. Stewart in the chair. Not less than five hundred persons were present participating, a large number of whom were delegates that arrived on the afternoon trains. Chairman Stewart rose to a personal explanation. He said that during the afternoon session, the sergeant-at-arms had asked him if he must admit all persons who declared themselves as opposed to the re-nomination of Governor Roberts and his answer to him was in the affirmative. This had been used against him by the Roberts men and he was charged with ordering that Republicans be admitted to the caucus. He desired to state that he supposed every man understood that he referred only to Democrats.

Captain William Eberheart, of Grayson, was made sergeant-at-arms, with authority to appoint two assistants. A committee of five

to devise plans, etc., was appointed, of which Mr. Briggs Goodrich was chairman.

A committee to draft such matter for insertion in the platform as represents progressive and, in fact, and truth, genuine Democratic principles was appointed, of which Captain M. Quinn, of Galveston, is chairman. Speeches were made by two prominent gentlemen, which elicited much applause, and which were replete with the genuine faith. An executive committee, of which Colonel W. C. Holland is chairman, was appointed. The caucus then adjourned, to meet at the court house at 8 o'clock this morning.

ROBERTS CAUCUS.

A caucus of delegates and others, who are urging the re-nomination of Governor O. M. Roberts, met at the Roberts' headquarters at 11 o'clock yesterday morning. Colonel Thomas Murray, of Collin, called the meeting to order, and nominated Colonel W. L. Crawford as chairman of the caucus, and Colonel Crawford was unanimously selected. On taking the chair, he declined making any remarks, and asked for a secretary. On motion Major John Waldhal, of Bexar, was chosen to this position, and Mr. W. G. Sterrett, of Dallas, was made assistant secretary. Mr. Walter Fisher, of Travis, was chosen sergeant-at-arms, and Messrs W. M. C. Hill, and W. F. Morton assistants. When Mr. Sterrett was made assistant secretary, Major John Henry Brown, designated him as one of the red-headed Democracy, which elicited cheers. A motion was made that the roll of counties be called, and that delegates present be requested to respond as their respective counties were named, and report the complexion of the delegates therefrom.

This motion prevailed, but before it was carried into effect Mr. Green Goodson, of Hamilton, moved that every person present who was not there in the interest of Governor Roberts' re-nomination retire, and Major J. H. Brown supplemented it with the statement that no gentleman would remain in the convention who was not a Roberts man, as it was a private meeting of the friends of that gentleman. This motion prevailing, quite a number of gentlemen left the hall, among them the newspaper reporters present. After this, what was learned of the proceedings of the caucus was obtained under difficulties and is not very full. An executive committee of thirty-one, one from each senatorial district, was appointed to ascertain as nearly as possible the sentiments of every delegate in the city, each one to take the counties in his district. There were a number of speeches made, the idea being prominently put forward that the governor was by no means safe of his re-nomination and that hard work lay before every one of his friends. The opinion seemed to prevail that not a few supposed Roberts men were very shaky and must be bolstered up. The largest number of votes that could be counted up for Roberts was 249, and some of these were only roused for by persons present, Major John Henry Brown answering for a number of counties.

There was nothing said in the caucus about the ticket the Roberts men should support, but it is pretty generally understood that the slate is O. M. Roberts, of Smith, for governor; L. J. Storr, of Calwell, for lieutenant-governor; D. T. Templeton, of Tarrant attorney general; W. M. Brown, of Falls, compiler; F. R. Lubbock, of Galveston, treasurer; W. C. Walsh, of Travis, commissioner of the land office; George Clark, of McLennan, court of appeals; W. L. Crawford, of Dallas, chairman of the executive committee. There is little doubt but that this is the slate fixed up by the Roberts managers, and that an attempt will be made to carry the entire Roberts strength for it. The caucus agreed to oppose the seating of any proxies in the convention, and advocates of no platform other than an endorsement of the Cincinnati platform be adopted. Judge A. W. Terrell and Colonel A. J. Peeler, of Austin, and Colonel W. L. Crawford, of Dallas, seem to be the Roberts managers. The convention adjourned to meet again to-night.

NIGHT SESSION.
