Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Greenville, at a Meeting Held on Thursday, 19th May, 1870.

RESOLVED, That the action of this Board with regard to a subscription of \$20,000 to the Air Line Railroad Company on the 1st November, 1869, be and the same is hereby rescinded. Resolved, That the Board of County Commissioners issue two hundred thousand dollars of County Bonds, bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent, payable semi-annually, the proceeds to be available for loans and other purposes of the County, the proceeds of said bonds (when sold) to be applied to the payment of a County subscription to the Air Line Railroad. Provided, The action of the Commissioners be considered by a vote of the people of the County at an election to be held on Saturday the 25th of June next. And provided further, That the Bonds to be constructed through the respective limits of the City of Greenville. And provided, That the County Bonds, when issued, shall not be sold for less than seventy-five (75) cents on the dollar. Resolved, That this Board give notice, through the papers of this City, that an election will be held in the different townships of the County, on Saturday, the 25th June, submitting the question of the rejection of their action in regard to the Air Line Railroad, to the voters of the County. 

Now know ye that I, ROBERT K. SCOTT, Governor of the State of South Carolina, in order that justice may be done and the majesty of the law vindicated, do hereby offer a reward of FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS for the apprehension and delivery, in any jail of this State, of the murderer or murderers of said Thomas A. Holtzeler, with proof to convict, or for such information as may lead to their arrest and conviction. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand, and caused the great seal of the State to be affixed, at Columbia, this 12th day of May, A.
