**Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners of Greenville, at a Meeting held on Thursday, 19th May, 1870.**

**RESOLVED,** That the action of this Board with regard to a subscription of \$200,000 to the Air Line Railroad Company on the 1st November, 1869, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

**RESOLVED,** That the Board of County Commissioners issue two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) of County Bonds, bearing interest at the rate of seven per cent., payable semi-annually, the coupons on the same to be receivable for taxes and other dues to the County; the proceeds of said bonds (when sold) to be applied to the payment of a County subscription to the Air Line Railroad. *Provided,* That the action of the Board be confirmed by a vote of the people of the County at an election to be held on Saturday the 25th of June inst. *And provided further,* That the Railroad be constructed through the corporate limits of the City of Greenville. *And provided,* That the County Bonds, when issued, shall not be sold for less than seventy-five (75) cents on the dollar.
