

It shall be the duty of the sheriff of each county in the State and of the police of each incorporated city or town in the State, to search for and seize any distillery or apparatus used for the manufacture of intoxicating liquors in violation of the laws of North Carolina, and to deliver the same, with any materials used for making such liquors found on the premises, to the board of county commissioners, who shall confiscate the same and shall cause said distillery to be cut up and destroyed in their presence, or in the presence of a committee of said board and who may dispose of said material, including the copper or other material from the destroyed still or apparatus, in such manner as they may deem proper.

" 'Section 2. That it shall be the duty of said officers to seize and then and there destroy any and all liquors which may be found at such distillery, and to arrest and hold for trial all persons found on said premises engaged in distilling or aiding or abbetting in the manufacture or sale of intoxicating li-




