PROCEEDINGS IN COUNCILS.—The stated meeting of Councils was held yesterday afternoon. Select Council.—The resolution from Common Council in relation to the murders in the First Ward was taken up.

Mr. Barlow offered an amendment authorizing the Mayor to increase the reward to \$5000. Mr. King thought that the reward already announced was liberal, and the character of the crime, no doubt, will act as an incentive to the officers to search out the murderer.

Mr. Freeman suggested that the original resolution should be adopted, as the Mayor was best able to judge of the amount required to secure the arrest of the parties.

Mr. Barlow said he knew of no amount too great to offer for the arrest of the perpetrator of such a crime.

Mr. Freeman again urged the passage of the resolution of Common Council, as it might be necessary to go above \$5000.

Mr. Barlow's amendment was not agreed to, and the original resolution was adopted, after some alterations in the phrasing.

Colonel Page, from the Special Committee to examine into the condition of the Gas Works, submitted a resolution granting permission to employ accountants and other assistants as may be necessary to make the investigation.

Mr. Freeman opposed the adoption of the resolution, as the committee in the first place had been appointed without any direct charge being made against the Trustees.

Colonel Page suggested that if this power asked by the committee was refused, the examination would be a farce.

Mr. Van Cleave submitted a resolution directing the Commissioner of City Property to have the American flag displayed at half mast on all the public buildings on the 14th inst.

Mr. Evans offered a resolution authorizing the Mayor to offer a reward for the detection and conviction of the murderer or murderers of the Deering family.

Mr. Marcer, of the Finance Committee, reported an ordinance to increase the revenue of the city.

Mr. Evans (in place) offered an ordinance, requiring all passenger railway companies, under a penalty, to have their cars, engines and cars outside and inside of their rail, whenever any repairs are made to the track.

Mr. Dillon states that such an ordinance was already in existence, and it was the duty of the Commissioner of Highways to see the same executed.

The ordinance was postponed for the present. Mr. Marcer presented a certified copy of a further supplement to the act incorporating the city of Philadelphia, passed April 4, 1856.

Also, a resolution directing the Chief Commissioner of Highways to enforce the ordinance requiring passenger railroad companies to place granite blocks on the outside and inside of their tracks, when repairs are made.

Mr. Griggs submitted a resolution providing for the appointment of a joint special committee to take into consideration the propriety of disposing of the Almshouse property and securing a site for a new building.

The infant was taken to the Almshouse. One of the colored nurses recognized the child as belonging to the accused, Fanny was held to answer by the same Alderman.

An Engel & Wolf's farm yesterday afternoon a difficulty occurred between William Leary and Jeremiah Ring, during which, it is alleged, Leary struck Ring on the head with a stone, inflicting him quite severely.

Leary was arrested and held for a hearing.

FIRE IN THE FIRST WARD.—About 9 o'clock last evening a fire broke out in a two-story brick building on Moore street, above Second Street, owned and occupied by David France—the first floor as a smoke-house, and the second story as a hay-loft.

The flames were first discovered in the room used for smoking meats, in which there were stored several thousand pounds of hams and Bologna sausage. The flames communicated to the second floor, which, together with its contents, were entirely destroyed.

Mr. France estimates his loss on the building at \$4000, upon which there is an insurance of \$500 in the Franklin Insurance Company, and \$600 in the Fire Association.

The loss on stock and machinery will amount to about \$2300, upon which he has an insurance of two thousand dollars in the Globe, and \$1000 in the Fire Association.

EXPLOSION OF A GAS-METER.—Last evening about half past 7 o'clock, the gas-meter in Garland's stable, seventeenth and Barker streets, exploded.

A curious feature of the affair was that the bodies of the Deering family had been removed to the stables during the afternoon, and at the time of the explosion the content fire there was of great excitement.

The bodies were removed, and the fire was extinguished, after considerable difficulty.

EFFORT TO RELEASE JEFFERSON DAVIS. Important Decision of Judge Underwood Involving the Late Proclamation of Peace.

Judge Underwood, of the United States District Court of Virginia, on Tuesday decided a very important principle on Alexander. It came before the matter of Thomas Javin. He was tried before the Provost Judge, under the Freedmen's Bureau, for assaulting and injuring a negro boy, and found guilty, and sentenced to pay five hundred dollars to the boy, and to be imprisoned six months, after which he was approved by General Angur, whose military district includes the counties of Alexandria, Fairfax, and Loudon, in Virginia.

Application for the writ of habeas corpus was made by the father of Javin, and the writ was extended by the late peace proclamation. The prisoner was brought before Judge Underwood under the writ, which was returned by the officers of General Angur, stating all the facts of the case, and adding that he had been held under military authority by the order of the President of the United States, all of which was certified on the back of the writ.

The hearing commenced at ten o'clock, and was held in the morning of the 13th inst. Judge Underwood decided, in substance, that the peace proclamation did not apply to such cases, and remanded the prisoner to custody. He held that this proclamation, in exempting Texas, precisely the matter of the Deering family, continued to exist. As long, therefore, as Texas is exempted the writ could not apply to such cases as that of Javin, even if the proclamation was legal, which is boldly denied by some of the ablest jurists of the country.

It is not doubted that accession sympathizers in Virginia, and everywhere else regard Andrew Johnson's peace proclamation as a universal pardon, and as merely preparatory to the full forgiveness and release of the chief of the Confederacy. But Judge Underwood does not seem to be of their mind.—Washington Chronicle.

THE PEER SHIP.—The England, which has brought a large crowd of plague-stricken people to this side of the Atlantic, is a ship of line which receives greenbacks for passage money, charging \$40 instead of \$45, payable in gold, which is the rate on board the Inman ships.

She makes up the lower end of freight, we suppose, by the dreadful crowding, which has doubtless caused the breaking out of the disease among her 1300 living souls at a time when it seems to have disappeared from Europe, and whether other vessels are landing their passengers in good health, it is, however, certain that but for the presence of those mysterious agencies which are present only in cholera seasons, there would, with all the crowding, have been no cholera on board the England, though there might have been ship fever, or smallpox, or other similar maladies.—Monroe Gazette.
