—The Rev. Dr. Van Deusen, of Grace Church, in this city, has declined the Presidency of Trinity College, to which he was unanimously elected a week or two since. —At the recent Diocesan Convention, of Maine, the Rev. Alexander Bugass was elected Bishop of the diocese. He declined to accept. The Convention then elected the Rev. F. D. Huntington, D. D., of Boston. —The Bishop of the Diocese of Massachusetts held an Ordination on Wednesday, June 29, St. Peter's Day, in Trinity Church, Boston, and admitted to Deacon's Orders Mr. Henry J. W. Allen, a candidate for Orders of this Diocese, and a student of the Philadelphia Divinity School. The sermon was delivered by the Rev. Edward Lounsbury. —St. Mary's Parish, Dorchester, Mass., has commenced the work of enlarging the church, in order to provide for its future growth. This addition will give room for about sixty new pews. A larger and more convenient chancel will be added, and also excellent basement-rooms will be provided for the Sunday School. A small tower will be erected on the northwest corner. The cost of these additions will be about \$12,000, the whole amount of which has been already subscribed. —The Right Rev. Bishop Randall, Missionary Bishop of Colorado Territory, has published an official list of visitations, extending throughout the Territory, and has entered upon the duties of the same. So vast is the field assigned to the Bishop, he will scarcely be able to visit during the present year, all of those "parts adjacent" which belong to his jurisdiction. On the day after his arrival in Denver, he selected a site for the Diocesan University buildings, and received from the proprietors of the very valuable tract of land of which it was a portion a bond for five acres, on the condition that a building be erected which, when completed with all that pertains to it, shall cost fifty thousand dollars. The land is on the choicest spot in Denver, and commands a beautiful view of the Rocky Mountains. —The Bishop of Western New York, during his episcopal visitations the present month, has made the following confirmations:— July 1, 17, in St. Mark's church, Candor; July 2, 5, in St. John's church, Speedsville; July 3, 12, in St. Peter's church, Oriskany; July 4, consecrated St. Andrew's church, Augusta, and confirmed 27 July 5, Trinity church, Boonville, confirmed 7; July 6, Con-tableville, confirmed 15; afternoon, Fort Leyden, confirmed 17.

This is the first donation received since the last Assembly. —The Committee on the Narrative of the State of Religion in the Presbyterian Church, appointed by the General Assembly, have made a long report, from which we make the following extracts:—"We have received narratives of religion, more or less full—some far too extended and diffuse, others much too meagre and uninteresting—from ninety-one of our hundred and thirty Presbyteries, and from the General Presbytery, including one of the Presbyteries in China, the Presbytery of California, within whose bounds are nearly a thousand Chinese, and the Synod of Northern India; also having examined them, feel that the Church has most abundant reason to thank God and take courage. No where does the word of the Lord seem to be going back-ward; and in many places it is evidently going forward gloriously." —The receipts of the Boards of the Presbyterian Church during the month of May were as follows:—Board of Domestic Missions, \$4915-85; Board of Education, \$2361-78; Board of Foreign Missions, \$8729-94; Board of Publication, \$2214-03; Board of Church Extension, \$340-00; Fund for Disabled Ministers, \$998-95; Assembly's Committee on Freedmen, \$436-04. —The pastoral relation existing between the Presbyterian Church of Bedford, Pa., and the Rev. R. F. Sample has been dissolved. He is transferred to the Presbytery of St. Paul. The pastoral relation between the First Presbyterian Church of Cedarville, N. J., and Rev. "A grand triumph took place in her honor on the occasion of her election." —The new Church of the Immaculate Conception, at Broadway and Market streets, Camden, will be opened for divine service on Sunday, by Right Rev. S. R. Bayley, Bishop of Newark. There will be service three times during the day. —A recent number of the *Catholic World*, commenting upon the rapid growth of the Catholic Church in the United States, has the following:—"Nowhere has the Catholic Church increased so prosperously, within the last fifty years, as in the United States of America. About two thousand churches and chapels built; an increase of one hundred and eight hundred clergyman; one hundred and sixty schools established for the Catholic training of 18,000 boys and 34,000 girls. Moreover, there existed, in 1857, sixty-six asylums, with 4966 orphans, of both sexes; twenty-six hospitals, with 3000 beds; four insane asylums, besides many other charitable institutions, all supported by the private charity of Catholics." AMERICAN BIBLE SOCIETY.—At the last meeting of the American Bible Society, books were granted to the amount of 18,103 volumes. Sixty-two auxiliaries were recognized, of which fifty-three were in Minnesota. George H. Stuart, Esq., of this city, and now in Ireland, has accepted the Vice-Presidency of the American Bible Society. CHAPLAINS IN THE NAVY.—The *National Baptist and the Methodist Advocate* call attention to the inequality in the distribution of naval chaplains among the several denominations. The latter paper says:—"There have been twenty-eight naval chaplains appointed since 1841, including those of the retired list, three of the latter having been appointed somewhat earlier. Out of all these the Baptists have had four, the Methodists five, and the Protestant Episcopalians twelve." THE EVANGELICAL ALLIANCE.—On Monday, the 9th instant, the organization of the American Branch of the Evangelical Alliance was perfected at the meeting held in Dr. Adams Lecture Room, Madison Square, New York city. This "Branch," as it is called, is rather a "grass" on the American churches, from which it draws its life. There was a disposition manifested by

the close-union Baptists to have a pledge from the Alliance that it would abstain from celebrating the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper; but the Alliance finally failed to give the pledge. The Executive Committee is to be composed of one clergyman and one layman from each denomination co-operating in the work, and the organization will soon take an active position. Professor Henry B. Smith is the delegate of the Branch to the Alliance which meets in Europe. He has already gone abroad. The time appointed for the meeting was the 25th of August, and the place Amsterdam; but the war and the cholera have caused a postponement. SUNDAY SCHOOL INTELLIGENCE. —The July meeting of the Brooklyn Sunday School Union was held in St. Anne's Episcopal Church, of which the Rev. L. H. Mills is rector, and Rev. Mason Gallagher assistant. In the absence of Andrew A. Smith, President, Mr. Samuel L. Parsons took the chair. The exercises were opened with prayer by the rector, Rev. L. H. Mills, who followed with a few remarks welcoming the teachers and friends of the Union, and considering it an honor to have such a meeting there. Several of the delegates followed in remarks upon the good work going on among the various schools in the city. The chairman alluded feelingly to the death of that faithful teacher and superintendent, the Hon. Moses P. Odell, and introduced his brother, S. F. W. Odell, who has taken his brother's place as superintendent of the Sands-Street Methodist School. In accordance with the action of the Ohio Sabbath School Convention, held in Sandusky on the 12th and 13th ultimo, the Executive Committee, to whom was referred the matter of securing a thorough canvass of the State in behalf of the Sabbath School cause, invited Professor J. Tuckerman to enter this field. He has, at the request of the Committee, resigned his position as President of Farmers' College, and will at once enter the work. He will visit the several counties of the State, and desires the friends of the cause to advise him of the best times of consulting them in reference to this great work, and to assist in gathering complete statistics in relation to the actual condition of the schools in their respective localities. —Two Teachers' Institutes, with special reference to the needs of teachers connected with the Methodist Episcopal Sunday Schools of Philadelphia, have been arranged by Mr. Thomas Sappington for the second week in October next. It is proposed to hold one "up town," and immediately following it one "down town," for the convenience of all sections of the city, that none may be excused for neglecting the privileges offered. The Rev. J. H. Vincent is to be conductor. All teachers of all denominations, and all friends of the cause are cordially invited. —In the church in West Milton, Vt., a class of young men in the Sabbath School have for a teacher a man eighty-four years of age, who is constant in his attendance, though living at a distance, and if any difficult question arises in the lesson, he appears with a written exposition on the subject.
