HOW A MYSTERIOUS ROBBERY WAS BROUGHT TO LIGHT.—The store of Hess, Rogers & Chambers, No. 411 Market street, was entered on the 7th of March last, and robbed of a considerable sum of money. The following history of the case was given at the time:—

A young man named William R. Mitchell, employed as a book-keeper in the station house of Hess, Rogers & Chambers, No. 411 Market street, was arrested upon the charge of breaking into and robbing the store of his employers. The evidence is mainly circumstantial. It appears on Wednesday night last an entrance was effected through a door in the rear part of the store. The fire-proof safe was opened by means of a false key, and the sum of \$600 was taken therefrom.

The books of the firm, which were also in the safe, were cut up, thrown into the stove, and burned. A brace and bit and "limmy" were found upon the premises the morning after the robbery, and a small quantity of blood was discovered upon the bit. The accused, when taken into custody, had a fresh wound on his thumb or forefinger. A final hearing will take place before Alderman Beiler on next Thursday afternoon.

On March 15th the accused was finally committed. At the hearing Jacob S. Hess, of Hess, Rogers & Chambers, testified that the same names made, he was satisfied that the losses of the firm, during the past two years, would reach upwards of \$6000; that the accused had been in their employ for three years, and during that time he had received the money orders and books. Mitchell was held in \$10,000 bail to answer at court.

Some time ago the detectives learned that Mitchell had an accomplice named James Boys, who had taken into custody a fresh wound on his thumb or forefinger. A final hearing will take place before Alderman Beiler on next Thursday afternoon.

A special meeting of Council was held yesterday, for the purpose of approving the salaries of Major D. P. Weaver, City Commissioner elect. In Common Council, Mr. Marcer, Chairman of the Finance Committee, reported a resolution approving of General George Caldwell and J. W. Fry as auditors of D. P. Weaver, City Commissioner elect.

Mr. Willis desired to know if the matter of the securities had been submitted to the Finance Committee, and if not, he would move that Council take a recess for the purpose of allowing the Committee to report.

The resolution was voted down, and the meeting adjourned to after which the Chamber adjourned.

The resolution was at once transmitted to Select Council, and that body concurred in the action of Common Council.

POLICE INTELLIGENCE.—John Williams, the colored man who was arrested on suspicion of having been concerned in the murder of the Hon. Mr. Raymond, at Woodbury, N. J., had a hearing at the Central Station yesterday. It was stated that the prisoner could not be identified by any of the persons who had suspected him of the murder, and he was discharged.

John Mason and George S. Roberts were brought on from New York yesterday on suspicion of having been concerned in the robbery of the lace store of Henry M. Day, in June last, and the robbery of the store of Hess & Co., North Third street. It was stated that the officers were not ready for a hearing yesterday, and a hearing was granted for Friday.

Ellen Russell, colored, was held yesterday at the Central Station on a charge of stealing some wearing apparel from a house at Eighth street and Goodwater alley.

THE FLOATING POPULATION.—Our city has probably been so full of people as it now is since the Convention met here that nominated Zachary Taylor for the Presidency. The hotels, with very few exceptions, are filled to their utmost capacity, and strangers are coming in and it exceedingly difficult to get a room at the hotels, which is half a mile around the city. A gentleman holding an official position in Chicago reached this city last evening, and at once set out to find a room at one of the hotels. After half an hour's unsuccessful search, during which he visited nearly all the hotels, when he half a mile around the city, he was about to give up in despair, when he was directed to a hotel which his guide had overlooked, and he started off in that direction, declaring that if he did not succeed, he would be compelled to take the cars and return home.

WHO SHOULD BURY THE POOR?—Since the cholera made its appearance in our city a few deaths have been detected among the very poor of the city, and their bodies were allowed to remain unburied for some time, in consequence of having no friends to attend to it. The Board of Health contended that they had nothing to do with it, and that the police were settling the question they sent a communication to the City Solicitor, and that officer has given his opinion that it is the duty of the Guardians of the Poor to attend to the burial of all paupers, except those which come under the notice of the Coroner.

CHANGES IN THE JEWISH MINISTRY.—The Rev. Dr. David Euborn has resigned his connection with the Knesseth Israel Congregation in Philadelphia, and has accepted the position of preacher in the new temple Adath Jesurun in New York, with a salary of \$4000 per annum. The Rodef Shalom Congregation, in this city, have chosen the Rev. Jacob Frankel, Hagan for life, with a salary of \$2000, and a retiring pension of half that amount, should he become disqualified. The Polish congregation, Beth Israel, also have increased Rev. Mr. Pape's salary by \$200.

THE PICKPOCKETS AT WORK.—The great throng at the Continental Hotel, last evening, enabled the pickpockets to successfully pursue their nefarious operations. Several gentlemen lost their handkerchiefs and watches, and others their pocket-books abstracted. Four alleged professional thieves were arrested in the neighborhood of the hotel, and were locked up at the Central Station for a hearing.

APPLICATION FOR AN INJUNCTION.—Yesterday was the time fixed for hearing the application for an injunction to restrain the Thirteenth and Fifteenth Street Passenger Railway Company from laying rails on Spruce Street between Broad and Third streets. At the suggestion of counsel the hearing was postponed until September next.

A RIOTING FIRE COMPANY SUSPENDED.—The Chief Engineer of the Fire Department suspended yesterday the Gook Will Engine Company for riotous conduct on Sunday morning in front of the Western House, in Twentieth street, below Pine.

A NEW FIRE.—The work of extending the wharf at Arch street, on the Delaware, has been commenced. The new pier will extend into the river 125 feet beyond the old wharf, and will be 66 feet wide. There will be 62 feet depth of water at the end of the pier.
