

CITY INTELLIGENCE.

THE HEALTH OFFICE—REPORT OF INTERMENTS.—The following is the weekly report of the deaths and interments in the city of Philadelphia for the week ending on Saturday, July 20, 1867:—

Of the 37 deaths for the past week, 24 were males and 13 females. The diseases which had the greatest number of victims were: Cholera infantum, 9; consumption of lungs, 3; inflammation of brain, 17; and marasmus, 26.

The ages of the deceased were:—Under one year, 18; one to two, 34; two to five, 14; five to ten, 11; ten to fifteen, 11; fifteen to twenty, 2; twenty to thirty, 13; thirty to forty, 27; forty to fifty, 18; fifty to sixty, 16; sixty to seventy, 19; seventy to eighty, 9; eighty to ninety, 6; Total, 337.

Foreigners.—United States, 292; Foreign, 51; Unknown, 14; People of color, 18; from the country, 8.

There were 13 deaths from the Almshouse. Sex—Males, 121; Females, 176; Boys, 127; Girls, 114.
