

CHRISTMAS AMUSEMENTS.

Nearly every regular place of amusement in the city will be open to-morrow, in the afternoon as well as evening, with extra attractions for old and young alike. Among the matinees announced to take place are the following:—

At the CRESNUT will be given the grand spectacular drama and ballet entitled *Condition*, which was received last evening by a large and delighted audience. It will be given every evening during the week.
