"Fidelio."

A full house last evening marked with decided approval the performance of Beethoven's only opera, Fidelio, by Mr. Maretzky's German Troupe. The applause was hearty, and the artists must have retired with the conviction that their efforts were appreciated, and that the opera-goers of Philadelphia still have some admiration to bestow upon works of undoubted genius.

Fidelio was excellent last evening; the orchestra was excellent, and the German singers threw themselves heart and soul into their parts. The first act was equal to the requirements of such a role as "Leonora," and her performance was somewhat lacking in spirit and expression, although in the main very satisfactory.
