IMPORTANT FROM EUROPE.

MacMahon Still at Chalons.

Bazaine Shut up in Metz.

Their Reported Junction Denied.

FROM EUROPE.

Important from the Front. LONDON, Aug. 24.—It is reported in London this morning that MacMahon is still at Chalons, and that Bazaine's position is unchanged. He is still at Metz.

MacMahon is isolated. MacMahon has not gone to reinforce Bazaine. The French themselves assert that the Prussians are in strong force on the west side of Metz.

The Reported Isolation of Metz Confirmed. Paris telegrams just received here declare that Metz is certainly isolated, that the Prussians have cut off communications between Thionville, Montmedy and Metz, that MacMahon and Bazaine are in daily communication, and that no mediation is likely to succeed unless Napoleon takes the initiative.

Contradictory Stories. Another Paris special says—Paris reiterates my special of yesterday that MacMahon's forces are with or near Bazaine, in the Argonne mountains. But another authority reports that it is only the "army of Chalons," regularly located there, that has joined Bazaine, and that the latter still keeps all his lines intact.

The Great Fire. ST. JOHNS, N. B., Aug. 24.—Heavy fires are raging in the woods along the boundary of New Brunswick, and State of Maine. The harbor of St. Andrew last night was illuminated by surrounding fires. Several villages in Charlotte county are also severely suffering.

OTTAWA, Aug. 24.—Large sums have been subscribed here for the relief of sufferers in the late fire, and the Government will probably grant assistance. Large numbers of people are living under tents loaned by the Government.

FROM WASHINGTON. Able to Distr. WASHINGTON, Aug. 24.—It is decided at the Internal Revenue Office that when Scheidtmann Schnaps is put up in bottles and labeled as a medicinal article it is liable to stamp duty.

Another Southern Bank. A certificate of authority was today issued from the office of the Comptroller of the Currency to the National Bank of Mayville, Kentucky, to commence business on a capital of \$200,000.

FROM CUBA. The New West India Cable. HAVANA, Aug. 24.—The expedition now laying the West India and Panama cable promises well. The cable is being laid at the rate of five miles an hour. The expedition will probably reach Santiago de Cuba to-morrow at noon. The electric current from the steamer to Batavia is perfect.
