

NEWS SUMMARY.

City Affairs. An act which passed the State Legislature proposes to require vessels over seventy tons burden entering Philadelphia to register and report at the Port Wardens' office. This means, in other words, that the vessels will be required to pay a fee. The Vessel Owners' Association are protesting against this as a "tax on tonnage," and they are going to see Governor Geary to have the act killed.
