THE BATTLE OF DORKING.

The sensational article from Blackwood, describing the German conquest of England in 1875, which we published a few days ago, possesses for patriotic American readers an interest distinct from that which appertains to the military dangers threatening Great Britain.

Whether the battle of Dorking or a similar battle is ever fought or not, the above extract truly states at once the present cause of British prosperity and one of the probable reasons of its future destruction.

Several of the European nations have already emancipated themselves from dependence on British factories, simultaneously enriching themselves; and Germany, now so much feared by England, owes all her strength to modern persistence in the wise policy of protection.

THE PAY OF FEMALE CLERKS.

Four of the ladies employed in the Fifth Auditor's Office have been recommended to the Secretary of the Treasury for promotion to first-class clerkships, subject to the same examination before the board recently appointed by the President as is given to the male candidates.

It is not creditable to the Government that a distinction has hitherto been made in this matter, as a very large number of the female clerks have families depending upon them, and require good salaries quite as much as their male collaborators do.

CUBA.

Reports from Washington indicate that it may be necessary ere long for our Government to take some decided action with regard to Cuba. It appears that a commission is now sitting at Washington to adjudicate upon the claims of citizens of the United States owning property in Cuba which has been seized by the Spanish authorities.

YESTERDAY a policeman who was convicted in the Quarter Sessions of a particularly outrageous assault upon an unoffending colored man was sentenced by Judge Allison to pay a fine of five dollars and the costs.

WHILE our citizens congratulate themselves upon the good apparent and prospective moral results of the substitution of a paid for a volunteer fire department, and while they desire to make due allowance for the many difficulties attending the establishment of the new system, they are naturally anxious that it should be rendered thoroughly efficacious at the earliest possible moment.
