### Electric Lights.

We have once before spoken of the feasibility of having electric lights put up here. The towns of Lake Charles, New Iberia and a few others have practically demonstrated the advantages resulting to the people at large, and to all the business men. The subject is not the Police Jury appointment committee of one, two or three, to go to the towns where these lights have been established and examine for themselves. To ascertain the costs, can afford no serious trouble and to report would be an easy matter. We think it not alone, expedient, but also a duty to light up the court house, and the public square in this town and from the figures we have learned of costs, therefor, from the authorities in Lake Charles, we are convinced the work can be done and the lights furnished for \$20 per month. The plant once established by the joint agreement of the Police Jury and the town Councils (the latter contracting for their lights) there is and can be no doubt that, nearly all if not every merchant of the town would have the lights placed in his store or place of business, thereby making it profitable to the plant. Many of the proprietors in private houses would adopt the electric light and we would have towns worth improving in other respects. We earnestly appeal to the Police Jury and to the town Councils of Opelousas and Washington to take this suggestion up, and to co-operate in a systematic effort to get an electric plant established. Don't postpone it. Winter is approaching and the dreary nights which always prevent social gatherings, church goings etc., etc., may be made less hideous and preventing. And let us further suggest that by the co-operation of Washington and Opelousas, the plant might be placed about mid-way between the towns. The lights could then be put in both towns with but little additional cost to the plant. Fuel might be more accessible, or should it be deemed expedient to use coal, transportation by rail would involve no greater expense than to Opelousas. Our sister town would no doubt give liberally to the work. Good people of the parish and of both towns, think the matter over.

### Be Up and Doing.

Opelousas, which up to a few years ago depended chiefly upon the cotton crop of the surrounding section, must now look for its business from a different source. The low prices now prevailing, which at present would not net more than \$20 per bale of cotton, would give to the business dependent upon the cotton but very poor returns, even if we had the prospects of a good crop; whereas this year the late rains have cut the crop down to less than one-half. But we have now the prospects for the largest rice crop that has ever been made in this section, and every point and every merchant who appreciates the situation competes for the business resulting from this rice. All the rice brought to this town is hauled by wagons upon the roads leading to Opelousas from the west. The question of hauling is the most important feature in the handling of the rice crop, and the towns that have the greatest efforts, and put the roads in good condition to enable the planter to bring their rice to the town, will have the business. It is a well known fact that most of the roads leading from the west are almost impassable, and unless the public-spirited citizens of the town of Opelousas will join in and give all the assistance they possibly can, the business dependent upon the rice section, which has heretofore been to this town, will go to other points that give the planter greater facilities for hauling. Every resident of the town is interested directly or indirectly in the increase of its business, and each one, whether doing a large or small business, should contribute towards the preservation and further increase of this business.

### Roos' New Store.

We had the pleasure of being shown through this edifice now rapidly approaching completion, by Mr. Roos and do not hesitate to say it is by far the handsomest and most commodious in Opelousas. It is entirely brick and the columns, 16 in number, are of iron. The elevator leading to the wholesale and clothing department, is placed a little to the rear of the center of the retail department. The ladies shoe department is designed to be entirely separated from the other departments and is to be so arranged that ladies cannot be intruded upon while trying and selecting their shoes. There will also be a neat department arranged for a lady cash accountant and the system of safeguards against errors and dishonesty (should any be attempted) will be, we may say perfect. The book-keeping office is located in the south eastern corner of the building and is so arranged as to be accessible from every direction and to enable the clerks employed in that department, to see over the retail department without the least obstruction. The safe stands to the rear of the clerical department and with a thick brick vault which is effectually protected by two iron or steel plate doors having combination locks of the latest and best improved style. Above and below the departments are admirably ventilated. Mr. Roos will lay down a concrete and cement walk on the north and west side of the building so to make the approaches to it safe and agreeable. The design and the building are throughout an ornament to the town, and we have no doubt that such a demonstration of taste and elegance will, as it should, attract increasing patronage.
