Oil on the Streets.

Manager Spencers of the Jennings Electric Light and Power Co., said Tuesday that he would undertake the task of sprinkling as many of our streets as the property owners desired. A cost of not to exceed \$25 per block, and that he would guarantee to keep down the dust. The Texas crude oil is being successfully used in many towns as a means of keeping down the dust and as a public disinfectant, because it has no equal. In some places it is being used as a disinfectant for out-houses, sewers and the like.

Mr. Spencer says that the use of oil on our streets would make them almost like macadamized streets, in addition to the dusting qualities. He says that the odor arising from the oil all disappears after twenty-four hours, and that the danger from fire has been greatly exaggerated. The oil even in ditches needs a very hot fire to ignite it. When used as a dust layer the oil needs only a light fire from one to three weeks, depending upon the amount of travel on the street. At the price asked by Mr. Spencer the oil would cost about the same as water.—Jennings Times
