

A LIFE HISTORY.

A SUNDAY MORNING BLAZE.

\$15,000 Worth of Property Destroyed.
At half-past 1 o'clock Sunday morning a mysterious fire occurred at the corner of Cypress and Johnson streets, in the premises of one of Warren, who was absent from his house at the time of the fire.

Owing to the terrible condition of the streets in that section of the city, it was before the engines could reach the scene, and a large conflagration was the result.

The residence of Warren was destroyed and the flames then extended to an unoccupied one-story frame house owned by Mr. Martinez on Johnson street, near the corner of Cypress. This property was totally destroyed; no insurance.

The flames then communicated to the adjoining house, occupied by H. Shipley and owned by Mr. Martinez, and left it in ashes. Whether insured or not could not be ascertained.

The adjoining one-story frame cottage owned by Mrs. Meyers, and occupied by Mr. Talbot, was left in ashes; no insurance.

The dwellings of Messrs. Castro and C. Lord was also totally destroyed. Whether insured or not could not be ascertained.

The flames, backed up by the heavy winds that prevailed at the time, extended to the adjoining house, No. 209 Cypress street, and totally destroyed it.
