Our friend talks as though the President were a justice of the peace or a district judge trying a culprit for a larceny or a forgery. The President understands the Louisiana case thoroughly; there is not a feature of it of which he is ignorant.

Heating, therefore, to go through some technicality of the law before acting, while eight hundred thousand people are on the verge of millions are suffering, seems to us to be belittling, in a criminal and disgraceful manner, a great and vital question.

This is not a case for attorneys to haggle over, and delay and refer through the technicalities of the law. The interests and destinies of States are above all statutes and mere rules of law, and they can not be swayed or determined by the adroit arts of the practitioner.

Such mighty issues are the subjects of policies of government and administrations, and they can only be settled by statesmanship.

If President Hayes, failing to recognize this fact, attempts to subject the Louisiana case to the process by which the fate of a forger or a horse-thief is determined, he will find, before long, that instead of pacifying a State, he has raised a revolution which will startle the country and fix upon the imbecility and treachery of his administration the responsibility for the ruin of a whole people and the shedding of oceans of human blood.

PROCLAMATION. FRANCIS T. NICHOLLS, Governor of the State of Louisiana.

Whereas, information has reached me that D. A. WEBER, a citizen of West Feliciana parish, was this day murdered in the town of St. Francisville by a person or persons unknown; and Whereas, I am determined to punish crime and repress lawlessness throughout this State:

Now therefore I, FRANCIS T. NICHOLLS, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do issue this my proclamation, commanding the officers of the law and all good citizens to aid in their utmost in arresting the offender or offenders aforesaid, to the end that they may be punished.

And I do hereby offer a reward of FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS for the apprehension and conviction of the said offender or offenders. Given under my hand and the seal of the State at New Orleans on this seventh day of March, A. D. 1877.
