SENATE CHAMBER,
New Orleans, Tuesday, April 17, 1877.
The Senate met pursuant to adjournment, the Hon. Louis A. Wiltz, Lieutenant Governor and President of the Senate, in the chair.

On a call of the roll the following Senators answered to their names:

On motion of Mr. Breaux the reading of the journal in detail was dispensed with.

I am also directed to inform your honorable body that the House is ready to meet the Senate in joint assembly to ballot for a United States Senator.

Senate bill No. 123, entitled "An act to create a commission to sit during the recess of the General Assembly and to consider the present license inspection and port charges imposed by State laws; to take evidence thereon and to report at the next session of the General Assembly such changes as in their opinion may be necessary."
Was on motion of Mr. Zacharie considered engrossed and ordered read a third time.

On motion of Mr. Zacharie the constitutional rules were suspended, the bill read a third time, finally passed, title adopted and ordered sent to the Senate for concurrence.

Senate bill No. 140, entitled "An act to confer on the civil district courts of the parish of Orleans jurisdiction over suits against delinquent tax collectors and their securities, throughout the State, and to secure the State and parishes by making the record of the mortgages, citations and returns of such suits in mortgage records and the parish records of said mortgages, citations and returns the real estate of said securities."
Was taken up and, on motion of Mr. Goode, indefinitely postponed.

On motion of Mr. Breaux, the Senate proceeded to the hall of the House of Representatives to ballot for a United States Senator.
The joint session was called to order by the Hon. Louis A. Wiltz, Lieutenant Governor and President of the Senate.

Seventy-one members and a quorum.
The President of the joint assembly then declared the object of the joint assembly was to ballot for a United States Senator for the term commencing March 4, 1877.

The Secretary of the Senate read the names of the candidates, to wit:
Hon. B. F. Jonas, of Orleans, Hon. Randall L. Gibson, of Orleans, Hon. E. C. Billings, of Orleans, Hon. Andrew Calaza, of Orleans, and J. E. Leonard of Carroll.

Representative Sartin withdrew the name of Hon. J. E. Leonard of Carroll.
Representative Stewart withdrew the name of Hon. E. C. Billings.

Senator Robertson nominated Hon. H. B. Kerneohan of Plaquemine.
The rolls of the respective branches of the General Assembly were then called with the following result:

Senator Texada voted for Hon. J. H. Grover—1 vote.
Senator Allain voted for Andrew Calaza—1 vote.
Representatives Briggs, Daries, D'Avy, Kelly of Winn, Kern, Lyons, McQueen, Robertson and Toler, voted blank—10 votes.
Senators Zacharie and Ogden, voted for Hon. Sam Walker, Sr.—4 votes.

Total votes cast 24. Necessary to a choice 15.
The President declared that as no one of the candidates had received a majority of the votes cast in joint assembly, there was no election.

On motion of Mr. White the joint assembly adjourned, and the Senate withdrew to its own chamber.
The Senate was called to order by the Hon. Louis A. Wiltz, Lieutenant Governor and President of the Senate.

Mr. Texada offered the following resolution: Resolved, That the following absent Senators: J. E. Bryant, J. Henri Breaux, T. A. Caze, Henry Dumont, J. A. Gla, Wm. Harper, Pierre Landry, T. B. Stamps, H. W. Twichell, S. Wakefield, David Young, Buel Sutton, be again invited to take their seats in this Senate.

On motion of Mr. Texada the rules were suspended to consider the resolution at this time.
On motion of Mr. Texada the resolution was adopted.
The question recurring upon House bill No. 290, section 16 was read.

On motion of Mr. Stubs the section was adopted.
