Francis T. Nicholls, Governor of the State of Louisiana.

Whereas, the political troubles which have weighed upon the people of the State of Louisiana for the past years have under the merciful dispensation of the Providence of God been brought to a happy end; and,

Therefore, I, Francis T. Nicholls, Governor of the State of Louisiana, do issue this my proclamation, fixing THURSDAY, the 10th day of May, as a day of thanksgiving and prayer, and do invite all the good people of this State on said day to abstain from their several avocations and to resort to their wonted places of public worship.

In testimony whereof, I have signed these presents and caused the same to be authenticated with the seal of the State of Louisiana, at the city of New Orleans, this twenty-ninth day of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, and of the one hundred and first year of the independence of the United States of America.
