CHARTER.

UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

PARISH OF ORLEANS.

BE IT KNOWN THAT ON THIS TWENTY-SEVENTH day of the month of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and seventy-seven, before me, Oscar Drouot, notary public in and for the parish and city of New Orleans, duly commissioned and sworn, and in presence of the undersigned witnesses, personally came and appeared the subscribers (none in number), all being residents of this city and proprietors of a certain business, established in this city, which appears being desirous of availing themselves of the privileges and rights afforded by an act of the Legislature of this State, entitled "An act for the organization of corporations," approved March 14, 1865, they had covenanted, contracted and agreed that they do, by these presents, covenant, contract and agree to associate themselves together and to form a corporation for the purpose of manufacturing and selling sewing machines, and all other articles of iron, in the city of New Orleans, and to this end and purpose they have established the following rules and regulations for the governance of said corporation.

ARTICLE I.

The name and style of this corporation shall be the CRESCENT CITY SEWING AND MINERAL WATER MANUFACTURING COMPANY, and its domicile shall be in the city of New Orleans, Louisiana. It shall commence business immediately and shall exist for the term of ten years from the date hereof, unless sooner dissolved by the board of directors or provided, during which time it shall exercise and enjoy all the powers, rights and privileges granted by law to corporations. It shall have a seal with such device as the board of directors may hereafter adopt. The president shall be the proper person upon whom all citations and other legal process shall be served.

ARTICLE II.

The objects and purposes of this corporation are declared to be the manufacture and sale of sewing machines, and all other articles of iron, silver, tinware, and other articles of iron.

ARTICLE III.

The capital stock of this corporation shall be eleven thousand six hundred dollars, divided into nine shares, all of which said shares have been and are hereby declared to be paid for. Transfers of stock shall be made only on the books of this corporation at its office, and no sale or transfer thereof shall be made by the holder thereof, unless the same be made in conformity with the intention to transfer or sell said stock shall have been given to the president of the corporation, and unless also this corporation, or in default thereof any one or more members of said corporation shall have had the privilege of purchasing said shares or shares of capital stock at the holder's price offered therefor outside of this corporation, or in default of any such offer, at the market value of such share or shares.

ARTICLE IV.

All the powers of this corporation shall be exercised by a board of directors, composed of five stockholders, a majority of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of all the business of the corporation. The board of directors shall annually, at their first meeting, elect one of their members as president, who shall hold his office for the term of one year, and until his successor is elected. The president shall preside at all meetings of the board of directors and shall conduct and manage the business of the corporation, and he shall be held to account for the same. In the absence or inability of the president, the board of directors shall appoint one of their members to act in his place. They shall have the power to make and adopt such by-laws as they may deem proper, and they shall perform all other acts which may be convenient or necessary to carry into full effect the objects and purposes of this corporation. Minutes shall be kept of all the meetings of the board of directors.

The first election of directors shall be held at the office of the corporation on this day, and thereafter on the first Tuesday of January of each and every year, due written notice of which election shall be given by the president to each stockholder, and the election shall be held on the first Tuesday of January of each and every year, and every succeeding fifteen days until an election be had, notice being given as aforesaid. At all elections or meetings each stockholder, either in person or by proxy, shall be entitled to one vote for each share of stock owned by him, and the persons receiving the number of votes representing a majority in amount of the capital stock shall be considered as elected, and they shall hold their office for the term of one year, or until their successors are duly elected.

ARTICLE V.

Proper books of account shall be kept, in which all the dealings and transactions of the corporation shall be entered, and they shall be open at all times to the inspection of the stockholders. There shall be exhibited yearly to the stockholders, at their general meeting for the election of directors, a full and complete account of all the business and affairs of the corporation, including a general balance of the books, and a statement of the profits and losses during the year.

ARTICLE VI.

The said stockholders (original stockholders) shall have the privilege of being employed by preference to all others in the business of the corporation, at salaries to be fixed by the board of directors.

ARTICLE VII.

No stockholder shall ever be held liable for the contracts, acts or faults of the corporation, nor of any kind of liability, in any circumstances whatsoever, in any further amount than the loss of his stock; nor shall any informality, in the organization of this corporation render this charter null.

ARTICLE VIII.

This act of incorporation may be altered and amended, or the corporation itself dissolved before the expiration of its term, by a vote of two-thirds of the whole capital stock, at a general meeting of the stockholders convened and held for the purpose after thirty days' notice in two of the daily newspapers of this city as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.

At the expiration of this charter, or liquidation of the affairs of this corporation shall be made by three commissioners, to be elected by the stockholders at the expiration of the term of office of said commissioners, their compensation and duties, as well as the manner and duration of their liquidation, shall also be fixed by the stockholders.

ARTICLE X.

Thus done and executed at my office, in said city of New Orleans, the day, month and year first above written, in presence of Messrs. Oniphore Drouot and John Legier, both of this city, competent witnesses, who have hereunto signed their names, with the seal of my office, and I, the undersigned, the whole after due reading of the foregoing.
