Hernandez as securities, conditioned for the faithful performance and discharge of the duties of said Dr. Aloe Chastant as coroner of the upper district of New Orleans, composed of the First, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth and Seventh Districts thereof;

NICHOLLS, Governor of the State of Louisiana, have thought proper to issue this my proclamation, calling upon all persons having an interest herein to show cause, in writing, at the office of the Secretary of State, in the city of New Orleans, why said bond should not be cancelled and annulled, and the above named securities discharged from any further liabilities in the premises.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto affixed my signature and caused the seal of the State of Louisiana to be hereunto attached, at the city of New Orleans, this nineteenth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight and of the independence of the United States of America the one hundred and second year.

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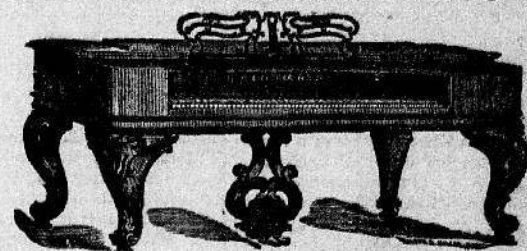
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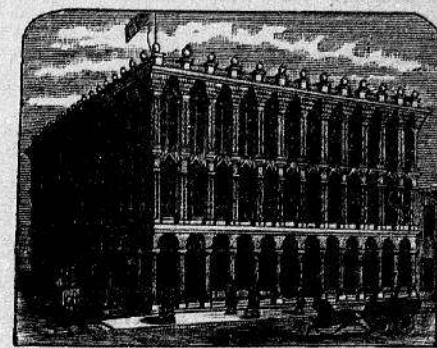
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
