Reform is on the rampage in Denison, Texas. That little town has just reduced the pay of its mayor to ten dollars a month...

SOME HOME AFFAIRS.

The police bill introduced by Mr. Harding in the Senate is a very commendable one as far as it goes. It simply fixes the salaries of the police officers, from chief to roundsmen, and requires the city authorities to set apart the first receipts of the city treasury as a special police fund...

We think that just such a bill as this should be passed, and we have all along urged the idea it embodies upon the Legislature; but the police force should not be preferred above other meritorious employees of the city whose services furnish their livelihood.

Did Senator Harding's bill comprehend the whole pay roll and all the current and necessary expenses of the city, we would give it our unhesitating support; but, as it is, he has only given the police force the benefit of the application of a principle the DEMOCRAT has long contended for.

In regard to the school teachers, Mr. Bower has introduced an admirable bill for their relief. His proposition is that one-half of the net total of the collected school tax shall be reserved for the use of the parish paying it, leaving the other half to go into the general school fund to be expended throughout the State.

Mr. Cox has introduced a bill in Congress to regulate the taking of the census in 1880. There are several good features in his bill. The supervisors of the census for each State, for instance, are to be appointed by the Secretary of the Interior. It is true, but the names must be suggested by the Governors of the States they represent.
