

Commercial and Financial Matters.

The brigantine Wakt arrived here yesterday from Rio de Janeiro with 4000 bags of coffee.

The steamship Troubadour reached here yesterday from Liverpool with 897 tons of salt, and the steamship Acton, from the same port, brought here 7050 sacks of salt.

State Consols opened yesterday at 62 1/2, and closed easy at 61 1/2, against 62 1/2, @ 62 1/2 on Monday. Premium Bonds closed weak at 25 1/2, @ 26 1/2, against 26 1/2, @ 26 1/2. The sales at the Stock Exchange footed up \$55,000 of State Consols and \$47,000 of Premium Bonds.

The vote of Texas at the recent State election aggregated 240,512, an increase of 39,648 over the presidential election of 1876, or 14 per cent, which, the Galveston News thinks, indicates a population in November last of at least 1,685,000. When it is remembered that a very full vote was polled at the presidential election, whilst at the recent State election there was but little organized opposition to the Democratic ticket, it is safe to conclude that the vote of Texas has increased 50,000 in two years, which indicates an increase of population in that time of between 300,000 and 400,000.

The Bank of England will be 185 years old the twenty-seventh of the coming July, having received its charter of incorporation at that date, and having been projected by William Paterson, a Scotchman. Constituted as a joint stock company, with a capital of £1,200,000, the whole sum was lent at interest to the government of William and Mary, then much embarrassed. At the outset it was a servant of the State, and has ever since continued such more or less. The charter, granted at first for eleven years, has been from time to time renewed, the last renewal subject to modification or revocation, having been in 1844. For awhile the business was done in one room; now the bank occupies, as everybody knows, a large building in Threadneedle street, and employs some 800 men. Nothing less than a £5 note is ever issued, and no note is issued the second time. The average amount of notes in circulation is £25,000,000.

In a lengthy article upon the shoe and leather trade the Boston Commercial Bulletin states that during the year 1878, there were 104 failures of shoe manufactories, large and small, aggregating liabilities of \$2,564,942 66. The failures of 49 jobbing houses are reported, with liabilities aggregating \$453,481 40; and also, 220 other retailers, with liabilities estimated at a round million, making a total of \$9,636,846 05, exclusive of the liabilities of numerous general storekeepers, whose principal creditors were boot and shoe jobbers. The number of failures of tanners, leather dealers and carriers, reported during the same period, was 72, with a total liabilities of \$4,021,577 08. Of the 72 failing firms some 2000 are on the business of tanning skins.
