

WORK PROGRESSING.

MEETING OF THE NEW ORLEANS AUXILIARY SANITARY COMMITTEE YESTERDAY.

It was nearly 3 o'clock when Gen. Cyrus Bussey called the meeting of the Auxiliaries to order.

The President introduced Dr. Brook, President of the Board of Health of the State of Illinois, who had been invited to attend.

A communication was then read from Mr. H. C. Brown, City Surveyor, relative to the condition of Claiborne canal, from Orleans street to Esplanade, and referred.

Several recommendations were made urging that running water be kept in that channel during the summer. It was referred to the Committee on Canals and Drainage.

The committee appointed to visit the several churches relative to the urging of the sanitary measures reported by the association, reported as follows to the several churches, and it was ordered printed.

Dr. White reported that he had examined Leo Phee and found that the complaints made against it were well founded. Administrator Houston acted promptly in reprimanding the officer who had the matter in charge.

Gas lines is to be placed over the deleterious substances under the directors' order. He also reported that Louisa Groves Cemetery had been fully filled up, and Administrator Mealey reports that the fence around the new cemetery on the ridge is nearly completed.

A report was received from Mayor Patton relative to the amount of money appropriated for sanitary use. City Surveyor Brown tendered his services to the association, which tender was received unanimously.

The report of the attorney of the board, relative to interests, was then read, and the right of the Council to act in such matters was shown clearly.

Dr. Brook then, when called upon, stated that he had prepared a report in 1868 showing that all the cemeteries in New Orleans ought to be closed. He referred to this report that he had made whilst on duty in New Orleans as second medical officer in the Department of the Gulf.

He spoke of the sanitary results coming from a careful quarantine, and favored that movement. He did not think that yellow fever was indigenous to this city from his experience.

He said that he came in an official capacity to this committee to see what the association was doing. Unless something more is done than has been in the past the city would be surrounded by a quarantine on all sides.

He spoke of an obstacle that one community could not do, and as there was to be a meeting of the American Medical Society, he desired to be able to state that everything was being done to prevent the spread of disease.

The sanitary problem to be solved in this city is that of drainage. What is wanted is to shed the water and the way to get rid of it. Water standing under houses must be carried off.

He showed how Chicago and Berkeley had desired to be able to state that everything was being done to prevent the spread of disease. The sanitary problem to be solved in this city is that of drainage.

Mr. C. A. Whitney read a letter from the secretary of the Tennessee Board of Health, inviting the association to send a delegate to the meeting of the State Board of Health at Memphis for the purpose of advising on the necessity of quarantining the river.

It was carried that the president, Mr. C. A. Whitney, appoint a delegate. Mr. White suggested Gen. Bussey, and the suggestion was carried.

The committee on canals and drainage made a report relative to flushing the gutters and the arrangements effected with boats, etc., to be used in the association to send a delegate to the meeting of the American Medical Society.

The W. W. Networks Company, through the president, Ed. Toby, Esq., tendered the loan of any pipes they might have to secure a supply of water along the levee.

Several suggestions from the surveyor were read in the report. It was received and referred to the committee on drainage for their consideration. The drainage for the purpose of forming a budget, as the cost of piping was great.

Mr. Hellman suggested that inasmuch as the city had appropriated \$100,000 for the purpose of laying the same amount for laying the pipe and for other work. Carried.

Mr. T. S. Elder said that a survey was going on now to see what it would cost to lay pipes. He thought if the city would assist a permanent pipe might be laid. The fire department can furnish fire engines and hose, and the water and gas companies also offer to do their share of the work.

The matter was the chairman said, before the committee of the conference committee was made and referred.

Mr. White thought that inasmuch as the meeting in Memphis was important, there should be more than one member sent. This was agreed to.

Dr. White mentioned the name of Dr. Holliday as an additional member, and the suggestion was carried.

Mr. H. Glider stated that a number of parties desired to know where disinfectants could be delivered.
