CHARTER.

STATE OF LOUISIANA. PARISH AND CITY OF NEW ORLEANS.

BE IT KNOWN THAT ON THIS TWENTH day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty, and of the independence of the United States of America, the undersigned, hereinafter named and undersigned, personally came and appeared the several persons whose names are hereinafter subscribed.

ARTICLE I. The name and title of said corporation shall be THE NEW ORLEANS ROLLING MILL AND LIME COMPANY.

ARTICLE II. The objects and purposes for which this corporation is established, and the nature of the business to be carried on by it, are declared to be the operation and maintenance, within the limits of the city of New Orleans, of one or more Rolling Mills.

ARTICLE III. The capital stock of said corporation is hereby fixed at the sum of five thousand dollars, to be paid for in cash.

ARTICLE IV. The business and affairs of said corporation shall be under the supervision and management of a Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V. Frederick Cameron, Alonzo D. Finlay, John Henry Behan, Benedetto Oratoro and Thomas O'Connor, will be declared the majority of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI. This act of incorporation may be changed, modified or altered, or said corporation may be dissolved, by the assent of the majority of the amount of the capital stock of said corporation.

ARTICLE VII. Whenever this corporation is dissolved, either by limitation or from any other cause, its affairs shall be liquidated under the superintendence of five stockholders.

ARTICLE VIII. No stockholder shall ever be liable for the contracts or debts of this corporation, in any amount greater than the amount of unpaid balance may be due by him thereon.

ARTICLE IX. I, the undersigned, Recorder of Mortgages in and for the parish of Orleans, State of Louisiana, do hereby certify that the within and foregoing charter of the NEW ORLEANS ROLLING MILL AND LIME COMPANY was this day duly recorded in this office.
