WHAT DO THE NEGROES SAY TO THIS?

A Remarkable Editorial in a Mugwump Paper in Cleveland.

[SPECIAL TO THE WORLD.] CLEVELAND, Dec. 9.—The Sunday World, the leading Sunday paper of this city and a Republican organ of Mugwump tendencies, said editorially to-day: "The question that will soon be of all-absorbing interest is the question of the color line, the question of the rights and privileges of negroes; the question not only of their right to vote and hold office, but their rights in a social way. Negroes are slaves no longer and no one, save perhaps a few rabid Southerners, would like to see the times of 1850 return. The question now rising is not a question of slavery; it is a question of equality. The question of the color line in the South seems to be purely a matter of politics, and the Republicans urge that every colored man's vote be counted because the negroes are Republicans. As far as however, as the majority of these Southern negroes are capable of judging what the rights of ballot-men, 10,000 ballot men trained to put folded pieces of paper in a slot would exercise as much judgment and understanding as 10,000 colored Republican voters in Louisiana and Georgia. The Northern negro is encroaching upon the white man's rights. He is claiming equal rights with the privileged citizens of this republic and forcing himself into their midst. He enters society circles, he dines at any restaurant, he comes to the opera-house with his girl and sits down beside you. He tries to join your club, and generally succeeds. He sits down in your seat on a railway train and he moves up close to your wife on a street car. Indeed, he seduces himself of the white man's equal in every respect; and it will not be many years before he will imagine himself his superior. A lady enters a dressmaker's shop. She has to wait a few minutes while a "colored lady" is being fitted. A man goes into a barber shop. He has to wait until a "colored gentleman" is shaved. The cry is, educate the negro. It seems that the more negroes are educated, the more forward they become. They will not recognize the fact that there is a prejudice against them, which prejudice can never be overcome. A lady does not know his level. He bows up where not wanted, like an inflated bladder. Trick the bladder and down it goes. Cannot the question of the color line be settled by forcing the negro to his level? There is a cry, the Chinese must go. A supplement of the cry is slowly being founded. Parity as yet it is only in the process of incubation, but there is no danger of it not being hatched. Negro check and negro forwardness will furnish the heat. It is too long since that the above is at variance with the usual order of things, but we believe we express the sentiment of the majority."


