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EIGHT HOURS FOR LABOR.

A Concerted Movement Started to Make That the Limit.

Enthusiastic Meeting of Last Night in New York, Brooklyn, and a Hundred and Forty Cities of the Country Words Caught from the Speeches at the Field Work at the Cooper Union Gathering.

At the recent convention of the American Federation of Labor at St. Louis, it was decided to inaugurate an agitation which should extend all over the country, for the purpose of bringing about by legislation a uniform eight-hour law, to take effect on May 1, 1890.

There were 3,000 people at the meeting in this city, held at Cooper Union, and the Brooklyn Labor Lyceum was crowded with enthusiastic advocates of the measure.
