Bank Examiner Hepburn Testifies Against Claassen.

NOVEL REVELATIONS TO-DAY.

President Jordan and Cashier Colson Also Important Witnesses.

At last the Legislature at Albany has taken hold of the scheme by which the Sixth National Bank, the Equitable and the Lenox Hill banks were "rehabilitated" after they had been practically looted by a gang of crooked financiers.

In a preamble and resolution introduced in the Assembly by Mr. O'Hare, of the Eighteenth District, suspicion is directed against President Conrad N. Jordan, of the Western National Bank, who is openly charged with having aided the conspirators by excessive advances from his bank upon the stock of the Sixth National in connection with the law and sound commercial usage.

THE GRAND JURY AT WORK.

The United States Grand Jury met this forenoon in the Federal Building. Among the cases on the docket were the transactions of Peter J. Claassen and George H. Pell, in the matter of the attempted wrecking of the Sixth National Bank.
