WALL ST. STOCK REPORTS.

The Unfavorable Bank Statement a Facer for the Bulls.

Burlington & Quincy Start Another Cut-Rate Squabble.

Chicago Despatches Report a Favorable Crop Outlook.

HE unfavorable bank statement of Saturday, showing as it did the unexpectedly large loss of \$7,700,000 in reserve, was a factor for the bulls at the start of business today, and created a feeling of hesitancy. At the same time their opponents were not disposed to be aggressive for the reason that, while the bank exhibit did show a large depletion in reserves, still the known movements of currency for the week indicated a gain of about five millions of dollars.

As the statement is made up on a system of averages, it was pretty generally conceded that local institutions were infinitely better off than the statement made them appear.

Considerable disappointment was expressed about the prospect in passenger rates by the Burlington & Quincy from Kansas City to Western points.

Of course, it is understood that these quarrels can be patched over night, and that bears in the stock market never bank heavily on passenger fights; yet it was thought that when the roads agreed to advance all west-bound rates to the Missouri River and St. Paul, that the last spark of hostility had been extinguished.

The fresh outbreak noted was therefore much deplored by the advocates of stable rates.

Chicago despatches say crop reports from the West and Northwest are very favorable, but especially so from Minnesota and the Dakotas.

The first car of new wheat was received at Chicago today. Mr. Macoun says that the report that Mr. Vanderbilt will go into the Atchison Board has been practically denied by the reticence of the Atchison people.

The stock market ruled weak and lower in the early trading.

Around 1 o'clock, however, there was a little upturn and prices rose 1/4 to 1/2 per cent. Sugar certificates and New England leading.

It is proper to state that the former were particularly soft during the morning hours.

Money opened at 2 1/2 per cent, and was later offered at 3 1/2 per cent.

HUNGER IN A BIG PROCESSION.

Striking Cloakmakers Arranging for a Parade To-Morrow.

Needy Cases Where Starvation and Eviction Are Threatened.

The Executive Committee of the Cloakmakers' Union have decided upon having a monster parade to-morrow afternoon if they can get the necessary permit from the city authorities, and are today busy making arrangements for the great event.

The proposed line of march is from Pythacoras Hall in Canal street to the City Hall, up Broadway to Union Square, disbanding at the plaza. Secretary Hirschman said this morning that he thought fully 5,000 people would be in line.

The general condition of the strikers is about the same as it has been during the last few days. Many of them are threatened with being put on the sidewalk by their sympathizing landlords and others are starving for want of food.

Some of the most needy cloakmakers are Isaac Farber, 3 Attorney street, five children and eleven weeks without work; Jacob Kassel, 132 Livingston street, ten weeks out of employment and no money to pay rent; Mr. Frenndlich, 151 Orchard street, no money to pay rent; Adolph Roth, 246 Stanton street, eight children and ten weeks out of employment; Morris Patofsky, 145 Forsyth street, three children and wife in a delicate condition; Bernhard Suterstein, 45 Allen street, ten weeks out of employment and threatened with eviction.

Jersey City's Convicted Election Officers Get 18 Months.

No Mercy for De Rancer—Sixty-four More to Be Tried.

There was a large crowd of politicians and others present at the Hudson County Court-house today to listen to the sentence of the four Jersey City election officers, Thomas Fallon, James Hart, Jacob Mosehell and James De Rancer, who were found guilty last Monday of conspiracy to violate the election laws in last Fall's election.

At 12.30 o'clock the prisoners were called to the bar and were sentenced by Judge Lippincott to eighteen months each in the State prison and to pay the costs of court.

The Court declined to accede to the recommendation of the jury for mercy on behalf of De Rancer, the Republican member of the Board, on the ground that he was equally guilty with the others, and had betrayed the trust reposed in him by the party he represented.

The accused were then conducted to the County Jail.

It is understood that application will be made at once for a writ of habeas corpus, and that an appeal will be made to the higher courts.

It is believed that the prisoners will be admitted to bail pending the proceedings.

The Great Strike of London's Police Declared Inevitable.

LONDON, July 7.—The Home Office has today received the news that a general strike of the London police is inevitable. It is believed that a general strike will occur, as, according to the declaration of the men, the entire force has determined to revolt if their demands are not complied with today.

The time named for the strike is between 9 and 10 o'clock this evening. Notice has been given by the police constables of Bow street today, stating that it is generally desirable, in the interests of the public, that the strike should be postponed to a later date, but that they will not be bound by the decision of the Home Office.

There are 3,500 men ready to lay aside their batons, mostly younger men, the older hands being retained.

The police authorities are holding frequent consultations at Scotland Yard, where reports for the force are pouring in by scores.

Today hundreds of new men have been taken on. The Home Office states that "a strike of the London police is now inevitable, and will take place at all divisions simultaneously at 9, 10, 11 p. m."

Everybody Wants to See Explorer Stanley Marriot.

LONDON, July 7.—Applications for tickets to Mr. Stanley's wedding are so numerous as to indicate the overwhelming interest generally felt in the happy event.
