EXTRA KNIGHTS HOLD ON

Further Hostilities Deferred Until the General Executive Board Has Acted.

To-Morrow's Meeting at Detroit to Begin or End a Great Fight.

Central Freight and Passenger Trains Moving Freely To-Day.

Webb Estimates the Vanderbilts' Losses at \$250,000.

Freight-Handlers at the Thirty-Third and Sixty-Fifth Street Yards Return to Work.

Local Knights of Labor officials remained passive to-day against the New York Central, while freight and passenger trains were moved freely from various points.

Master Workman Lee and Committee Valentine remained on the scene, but could give no information as to what would be done to continue the strike.

They are placing their reliance upon to-morrow's meeting of the Order in Detroit, when the whole question at issue with the Vanderbilts will be submitted to the General Executive Board.

If the board, which controls the Order in the United States, sustains the action taken by the local officials, it will necessarily inaugurate an aggressive campaign. If, on the other hand, it counsels peace, the tie-up will be officially declared off.

Master Workman Valentine was seen by an Evening World reporter and denied emphatically that the Knights have given in or considered themselves defeated because of the refusal of the locomotive engineers and firemen to respond to the call to abandon their work in sympathy with the strikers.

"This strike is not yet over," he added, "nor will it be until the Central people accede to our request. This fight is for good or no long as the Company deny us every request."

"We wanted the trouble settled by arbitration, but Mr. Webb declines to do this. Our men are strong and undetermined as ever to win this fight. We have the sympathy of all labor organizations, and if we are defeated it will not be the first defeat for organized labor."

"The Central management is too sanguine. The fight is not ended, and there will be developments to-morrow that will surprise some people."

It is the general belief to-day that the present serenity and apparent smoothness of things are nothing but the lull before a storm—a tempest that means the general ending of the entire Vanderbilt system, including the Lake Shore and Michigan Southern, the Michigan Central, the Canada Southern and the newly acquired New York and North-western.

The impudencia at the Knights' headquarters this morning was that no new order will take place in the nature of further tie-ups until the General Executive Board meeting in Detroit to-morrow.

HOW IT IS MURDER

A Coroner's Jury Bring in a Verdict Against "Liverpool Jack."

He is Found Responsible for William Reilly's Death.

The "Man-Catcher" Committed to the Tombs Without Bail.

Coroner Messmer and a jury began an investigation this afternoon into the cause of the death of William Reilly, whom John Fitzpatrick alias "Liverpool Jack," the notorious kidnaper, is accused of having killed and beaten in front of Conlin's saloon in Morris, near Greenwich street, one night about two weeks ago.

"Liverpool Jack" was brought down to Part III of the General Sessions from the Tombs this afternoon, where he was met by his lawyer, William F. Howe.

The prisoner looked nervous and worried and seemed to feel the seriousness of his position.

Coroner Messmer arrived with Acting District Attorney Bedford at 2.30 p. m. and after the jury had taken their oaths the Coroner began his charge. He laid out as far as the taking of Reilly's autopsied statement in his narrative of the case, and was going to read it to the jury when Coroner Howe jumped up and objected very strongly.

Mr. Howe endeavored to make a long speech, but Coroner Messmer cut him short by reading the declaration.

Dr. Joseph Stephenson James Manning, Ambulance Surgeon of the Chambers Street Hospital, was the first witness, and testified that Reilly told him that he had been kicked by a man whom he called "Liverpool Jack."

Angus Scintz, 30 Rector street, a longshoreman, was the next witness. He had known Reilly for three weeks and he saw him the night after he was asked, "What did Reilly say to you?" asked the Coroner.

Mr. Howe has objected for the fourth time to the evidence, but Coroner Messmer overruled the objection and refused to allow the stenographer to record it.

"I shall apply to the Supreme Court, you are not to allow me to be heard," replied Mr. Howe.

"You can do what you please," retorted the Coroner. "This is the coroner's court, and not a law court."

The witness went on to say that Reilly told him on the evening of July 11, 1901, that he was going to the hospital with him to get his finger treated.

Carl Clipp, a restaurant keeper, of 30 Rector street, testified that he had heard with him for three weeks.

The day following the assault upon Reilly the witness said he asked him how he got hurt.

"Liverpool Jack," he said, and that was all the conversation I had with him."

Peter Smith, who was tendered for Canton at the time of the alleged assault upon Reilly, told a story that seemed to contradict the story told by the Coroner and to the District Attorney.

The witness said he was closing up the saloon on the evening of Saturday, July 28, about 11.30 o'clock.

Fitzpatrick was standing at the bar when a man came in and had some words with him. He testified that this was Reilly, and that he was drunk and had insulted Fitzpatrick.

"Do you put him out?" asked the Coroner.

"No, he walked to the door. Somebody might have helped him out. Fitzpatrick remained in the store all the time."

Coroner Messmer then asked Mr. Howe if he had any witnesses.

"Certainly not," said Mr. Howe, "you have not yet introduced any legal evidence against my client."

Mr. Howe's motion that the anti-union statement of Reilly and the rest of the testimony be stricken out as being illegal was overruled.

The jury in the following words: "I would believe the testimony of a dying man against 10 or 20 men to the contrary."

The jury remained out about fifteen minutes and then came in with the following verdict: "We, the undersigned jury, find that William Reilly came to his death by injuries received, inflicted upon him by John Fitzpatrick, also known as Liverpool Jack."
