RUNNING SHORT OF LYMPH.

Many Applications for Inoculation Deated at the Hospitals.

Dr. Koch's lymph, according to Dr. Heintzmann, a physician to St. Michael's Hospital, who talked with an EVENING WORLD man this morning, is so far an assured success in cases of lupus; but the slow development of the inoculation of persons suffering from tuberculous lesions has puzzled the physicians to such an extent that they are powerless even to predict the probable outcome of their experiments.

In the hospitals in this city where there are patients under the Koch treatment for lupus the most favorable developments have taken place, but the tuberculous inoculations have been far from encouraging. As a result, the experimenting physicians have decided to examine examining consumptive applicants, and will confine themselves, for the present, at least, to the treatment of lupus.

So far the lymph injections have been attended with no accidents, and the only death that has occurred was that of the little son of a man who died in the New York Foundling Asylum Sunday. She had been inoculated with the lymph Friday, but his alleged caritative propensities failed to save her life.

Hon. George Clark said this morning that the little one had died from tubercular meningitis, which had fully developed before inoculation.

There is unanimity in the reports that the inoculated persons under treatment in the various institutions are all doing well.

At the German Hospital there are now seven cases, two of whom are suffering from lupus, while the remainder have incipient tuberculous lesions. The most gratifying signs are visible, and as a consequence Dr. Jacobi will inject the lymph into the patients again this afternoon.

The twenty-seven patients in St. Michael's Hospital will be re-inoculated this afternoon. Dr. Hainemann, of St. Luke's, will also re-inoculate the fifteen patients under his charge, in addition to those new lupus cases which are expected to-day.

Applications for the Koch treatment continue to pour in from all parts of the country. It was stated this morning that Cornelius Hugh Fay, who is known to be a sufferer from a pulmonary affection, has, through his physician, Dr. Hirsch, applied for treatment at St. Luke's Hospital.

The present supply of lymph is so limited that all applications are treated with much reserve. Bellevue, New York and St. Vincent's hospitals, as well as several private institutions are preparing to experiment with the lymph just as soon as new supplies reach this city from Berlin.

Dr. Heintzmann, Jacobi and Klement said this morning that they were daily expecting fresh supplies of lymph direct from Dr. Koch's laboratory.
