SHOT DEAD BY A MANIAC.

A New York Man One Victim of a Pullman Car Tragedy.

Poster, Hinson & Co., the clear manufacturers at 677 First avenue, received a telegram this morning announcing that one of their traveling salesmen, Isidor Meyer, had been killed by a maniac in a Pullman coach.

The tragedy occurred on the St. Louis and Iron Mountain road, near Bald Knob, Ark. Meyer was one of the victims of three shots fired by John W. Greaser, a Vincennes, Ind., man, who was stopped in his frenzy only after he had also killed the conductor of the train, L. W. Leech, of St. Louis.

The train halted out from the station at Bald Knob soon after 10 o'clock yesterday noon, and in the Pullman coach were but four persons, Greaser, Conductor Leech, salesman Meyer and an unknown woman.

Leech and Meyer were seated together in conversation, when without a moment's warning the crack of a revolver rang out and the next instant Meyer fell back with a bullet in his head. A second crack followed and the bullet struck Meyer in the right arm.

Leech, terrified, fled to the rear of the coach, and the maniac, Greaser, who had fired the shot, rushed forward to the front of the train.

The conductor grabbed the belt-rod, and with a shout, pressed his revolver up against the maniac's forehead, who had been placed under restraint at Fort Myer, Tex., and had to be shackled by a man in uniform.
