Shock of Levy Brothers' Big Failure Too Great for One of the Partners.

Sheriffs in Charge of the Big Broadway Store.

No New York Failures Expected to Follow Levy Bros' Disaster.

Announcement of a failure involving a million of dollars in liabilities, and resulting in the insanity of one member of the implicated firm, started the entire cloth and clothing trade this morning.

Levy Brothers & Co., wholesale clothing manufacturers at 610, 612 and 614 Broadway, is the firm, and its troubles were precipitated by the attachment of its stock and fixtures by the Sheriff.

Two attachments, one for \$20,000, \$4 in favor of the National Park Bank, and the other in favor of Joseph Lillenthal, a money broker at 204 Broadway, for \$19,700, were served by Deputy Sheriff Victor Heimbarger.

News of misfortune travels fast, and the service of these two writs was quickly followed by the appearance to the Sheriff of many other writs against the doomed clothing firm.

Deputy Sheriff Heimbarger was kept busy recording them this morning.

Some of them were in favor of Augustus D. Jauch, for \$4,001; Martin & Lawrie, for \$2,567.00; Oelshorn & Dommerich, for \$18,870.70; William Lantack, for \$2,549.00; Nathan May, for \$20,000; Pacific Bank, for \$1,605.92; Julius Ballin, for \$2,841.39; Nathan Elkanor, for \$1,478.97; and John C. Downing, for \$1,660.35.

Other creditors of the firm for large amounts are the Importers and Traders' National Bank and the Central National Bank, the former's claim being about \$50,000, and that of the latter nearly \$40,000.

These banks had no further security for their loans than certain notes which were given as collateral, and apparently cover the firm's indebtedness.
