HYMEN THE ARBITRATOR. He Succeeds in Happily Settling Some Big Bank Cases. (SPECIAL TO THE WORLD.) NEWARK, Pa., June 2.—Hymen's gentle influence and an old man's illness have united in settling important bank cases. The Wallace bank failure in 1884 resulted in numerous prosecutions for obtaining money under false representations, but Col. D. H. Wallace, President of the bank, had since lived in Arizona, reputation being refused. One by one the cases were abandoned, and yesterday a motion was made that a nolle prosequi be permitted in the only two remaining cases, one prosecution being Mrs. Barbara Genkinger, next week a son of Mrs. Genkinger will wed a niece of Wallace, the bride being heir to a goodly portion of the vast estate of the late R. W. Cunningham. This fact and the old age and illness of Wallace, who wishes to return to New Castle, hastened the settlement of cases that involved thousands of dollars.

Congressman Herbert Will Now Vote Himself to His Law Practice. (SPECIAL TO THE WORLD.) WASHINGTON, June 2.—A decided stir has been caused in Congressional circles by the announcement that Representative Hilary A. Herbert, of Alabama, will retire from public life upon the expiration of his present term. In speaking of the reasons that have led to this decision Mr. Herbert said to-day: "My mind is fully made up. I shall engage in the practice of the law at Montgomery, Ala., where I have the prospect of an agreeable and I believe a profitable law partnership. Col. Herbert said that, like many another member, he had arrived at a time of life when he realized that service in the House of Representatives is a costly gratification of ambition. There is certainly no pecuniary profit in it. When his present term should have expired it would be a sixteen years' interruption of his professional career. There are other worthy aspirants in his district, and he is in favor of their having an opportunity. As for himself, after 1892 he will not be in Congress again.
