

MISS NEWBECK'S WEIRD STORY

Found Struggling in the East River at Midnight.

She Claims that a Man Deliberately Threw Her into the Water.

The Brooklyn police have a mystery on their hands to-day which they are endeavoring to solve.

A pretty seventeen-year-old girl was found struggling in the East River at the foot of Milton street shortly before midnight last night, and when rescued she claimed she had been pushed overboard by a young man.

The girl is a pretty brunette. She gave her name as Katie Newbeck, and claims to reside at 408 East Seventy-second street in this city.

At 11.40 last night, Watchman Harry Jones and Edward Maguire, who are in the employ of the American Manufacturing Company, which has its works at the corner of Noble and Oak streets, Brooklyn, were startled by hearing a scream for help. The voice sounded from the river.

Running down the pier at the foot of Milton street, they saw a young girl struggling in the water. The watchman quickly obtained a board and reached the girl as she was going down to the last time.

She was hysterical with excitement and fright. After the watchmen had succeeded in quieting her she told a most startling story.

"I was walking along the street this evening," said she, "when a young man came up and spoke to me. We got into conversation, and he suggested that we should take a walk down to the river."

"We went down to the pier, and after some time he pushed me off from the dock into the water."

"Can you describe the man who you say threw you into the water?"

"He was a young man, with dark complexion and a slight black mustache. He wore a blue coat and a hat with a red band."

The case was reported to the police of the Seventh Precinct, and Detective Sergeant George Queen was detailed to investigate the girl's story.

Robert Smith, a watchman in the employ of the American Manufacturing Company, was found by the detective. Smith says he was on duty at the time the girl was thrown into the water, and saw her pass by. She was alone and was walking in the direction of the pier.

The detective claim to have found several others who saw the girl alone, and they profess to disbelieve her story. They say that she either tried to end her life or fell off the dock, and that the girl was taken to St. Catherine's Hospital.

A STOMACH PUMP SAVED HER.

Mrs. Salzer Took Poison When Scolded by Her Husband.

Mrs. Dora Salzer, of 710 Ninth avenue, was a prisoner in the Yorkville Police Court this morning on a charge of attempting suicide by taking Paris Green.

No one appeared to press the charge, however, and as she fastidiously took the poison by mistake, Justice McMahon discharged her.

But Mrs. Salzer's husband, Herman, tells a very different story. He says that her act was deliberate, intentional and threatened beforehand.

Mr. Salzer is a merchant tailor, and he and his wife live in the rear of the shop, which is on the street floor.

They have been married ten years, but have no children. Mr. Salzer told an EVENING WORLD reporter this morning that his wife was in the habit of getting into quarrels with him.

The semi-suspicious spirit was due early this week and arrived promptly on time. Salzer had neither breakfast, dinner nor supper on Monday nor on Tuesday, and between 2 and 4 o'clock on Wednesday she was taken to a clinic. This is what Mr. Salzer says:

"You see, I hadn't had a meal for two whole days, and I was very hungry. I said to my wife: 'No decent woman would do as you are doing.'"

"She said she was going out for a very little plain chowder, and when he got back with it she threw it into the sink. I told her she hadn't ought to do that, and she said she had for money and I didn't want it wasted."

"Within five minutes after she threatened to kill herself, Mr. Salzer says his attention was attracted by the sound of a door being slammed in the room back of the tailor shop, and he went to see what was going on."

"How do you know she got in nobody above?"

"Mr. Henry Kulp, of 350 West Forty-second street, and a stomach pump were hastily summoned, and in a short time Mrs. Salzer was out of danger. She was taken to the West Forty-seventh street police station and reported the affair, and the woman was arrested."

Mrs. Salzer is thirty-four years old and rather good looking. While she was at court she was very nervous, and she was very interested in what was done with her, and then burst into tears.

MUST HAVE THE TRUST BOOKS.

Sugar Refiners Ordered to Produce Them by Judge Cullen.

Justice Cullen heard argument this morning in the application for the dissolution of the charter of the Brooklyn Sugar Refining Company. The case came up in the Brooklyn Supreme Court. James A. Taylor objects to the Company being dissolved, on the ground that the trustees are trying to freeze him out.

John E. Parsons, representing the Trust, admitted that Taylor was not acting in good faith, and has instituted the suit for stock-piling purposes. The argument will be concluded to-morrow, at which time Judge Cullen has ordered the Trust's books to be produced in court.

SHOTS IN THE BOARD OF TRADE.

Professional Episode Among the Chicago Brokers This Morning.

CHICAGO, July 22.—Three recoupling shots from a revolver in the great hall of the Board of Trade at 11.15 o'clock this morning created a tremendous sensation.

Brooklyn Says Census Bulletin 82 Is Either False or Foolish.

Comptroller Jackson Points Out Gross Injustices to His City.

Comptroller Theodore F. Jackson, of Brooklyn, this morning made a written statement calling attention to the misrepresentations of mistakes made by Supt. Robert F. Porter in Census Bulletin No. 82.

Mr. Jackson says:

"Census bulletin 82 in its preface is stated to be a balanced statement showing in detail the receipts and expenditures for one year of 100 principal cities and 100 principal cities in the United States, compiled in each case mainly from the published reports of the representative cities in question. . . . In every case it has been approved by the proper municipal officer and no objection made thereto."

"By the last statement it is meant to be understood that the arrangement and condensation of the figures for the purposes of Bulletin No. 82 have been submitted to the Finance Department of this city for examination or correction the statement is not true. . . . No such comparative or other statement, showing the per capita expenditures of this city as compared to the other cities of the United States, has been submitted to the Finance Department of Brooklyn."

MORE MUTINY OF THE GUARDS

Queen's Soldiers Overworked During the Kaiser's Visit.

Wanted a Day Off and Got a Parade Order Instead.

LONDON, July 22.—To-day a startling story of another mutiny in the British Army, the facts of which seem to have been kept quiet up to the present.

According to the story, this third serious mutiny among the guards during the past year occurred in the Second Battalion of the Coldstream Guards, whose Colonel is Gen. the Hon. Sir A. F. Harting, K. C. B.

The Second Battalion of this regiment has been quartered at Wellington Barracks, Birdcage Walk, close to Buckingham Palace, and has been in the guard of honor and incidentally during the recent visit of the Emperor William of Germany to London, taking a prominent part in the parades, reviews and processions which were arranged in honor of the Imperial visitor.

This work necessitated a considerable amount of extra duty, and after the departure of the Emperor the guards expected to be allowed at least a day free from guard mounting.

Instead of being granted the day off they were ordered to parade in full marching order, then grumbling, cursing and fierce muttering were heard throughout the company rooms of the barracks. The whole battalion for a period seemed determined to refuse to turn out.

The Coldstream's officers repaired to the company rooms and arranged with the mutinous privates, who finally sullenly consented to parade, but arriving upon the parade ground the behavior and bearing of the coldstreams was so glaringly insubordinate that they were marched back to barracks.

The officers there issued orders confining their commands to barracks for three days as a punishment for their insubordinate conduct, and that ten senior privates should be placed under arrest with the view of trying them by court-martial.

No sooner did the main body of the excited guardsmen hear of this order than they gathered in the barracks and declined to emerge from their quarters, and the ten senior privates should not fare any worse than their comrades.

A considerable time was spent in parleying with the mutineers, and they were finally persuaded, on the ground that they would only make matters worse for all concerned, to open the door and listen to their officers.

The mutinous coldstreams were then addressed by Gen. Harting, who, by judiciously stroking the soldiers' egos, figuratively speaking, succeeded in quieting them down.
