

English Warrants for the Arrest of the American Journalist.

A Suggested Incendiary Fire Does a Damage of \$50,000.

A fire which broke out at 4 o'clock this morning totally destroyed the glass works of John M. Huber, located at the corner of Mauger street and Morgan avenue, Brooklyn, E. B.

There were a half dozen wooden frame buildings occupied as factory and storehouses, all of which burned to the ground, despite the efforts of the firemen.

The buildings were valued at \$150,000 and insured for \$110,000. The loss on stock amounted to \$15,000 and to machinery \$20,000.

No difficulty was experienced in securing a good water supply.
