Edward Field had borrowed large sums of money from his father at various times, and these in the aggregate are believed to have amounted to something like \$500,000 or \$600,000.

Mr. Field's fortune is estimated at several millions of dollars. At one time he was ranked in wealth in the class with Jay Gould, Russell Sage, and the Vanderbilts, but he lost a great deal of money in comparatively recent days in Elevated Railroad and other speculations.

FIRE BY THE WIRES.

Pennsylvania Road's New Depot Damaged \$75,000. An Exploding Gas Meter Aided in the Destructive Work.

Fire and an explosion of gas destroyed early this morning a portion of the new passenger depot, train shed and office buildings which have just been erected at a cost of nearly a million dollars by the Pennsylvania Railroad in Jersey City.

The fire broke out about 3.30 o'clock in a part of the old wooden depot, inside the ferry shed, which had been left standing for temporary use, the lower portion as a brakemen's waiting-room and the upper portion as an exit for passengers.

There was more delay on account of the danger from electric wires. The depot and part of the office building are lighted by arc lights, and it is supposed that one of the wires set fire to the roof of the depot.

The old depot was as dry as tinder, but the wind fanned the flames upward, and, curiously enough, the lower part is not damaged by fire at all. The flames, however, enveloped the new depot and made their way towards the east end of the general office building.

This structure was of brick and five stories high. It was not yet out of the hands of the contractor, although partly occupied. The first floor was used as the baggage room, the second for the company's post-office, the third for the engineer's department and Division Supt. Brown, the fourth by General Supt. Jackson and the fifth for offices for minor officials.

The east wing of the building was completely gutted. The loss on it and the furniture amounted to about \$50,000, but the books and documents which were destroyed were valued at four times that sum.


