EXTRA. INSIGHT WINS.

A 20 to 1 Victory Surprises the Talent at Guttenburg.

OBJECTION BEATS BOLIVAR.

Pres't Walbaum and Eight Bookies Arrested and Bailed.

OFFICIAL TO THE EVENING WORLD. GUTTENBURG RACE TRACK, Feb. 23.—The track at Guttenburg today was a perfect bog. The thick mud was ankle deep and the horses had great difficulty in making a decent showing in it. Moreover, it was full of holes and dangerous to run on.

The attendance was quite large, which was surprising considering the poor quality of the programme.

The wretched condition of the track was shown when Wendaway slipped into a hole at the head of the stretch in the first race and fell.

Neither horse nor jockey was injured. Sir Laurence was the favorite, and after opening up a gap of six lengths on the turn, Morris sat still and Sir Laurence galloped in an easy winner.

Quibbler, at the false price of 15 to 1, was second. Marty B. was well played and landed third. Pan Handle was a strong second choice, but was never in the race.

The second race found Luster a red-hot favorite at odds of 2 to 5. He came in third close up. He lost much ground during the first part of the race. Crab Cider and Lady Fuller, two strong second choices, fought it out between them, the former winning by a head.

Capt. Graham and a force of constables appeared at the track shortly after the second race and arrested President Walbaum and the express carriers of the Gibraltar, Camden, Gotham, Virginia, Manhattan, Star, Grand and Marion clubs.

The men who had been before Justice Lockwood, who was holding court in Eugene Leight's barn, and released in \$300 bail each, furnished by the express carriers, were taken to the police station and returned to the track and continued business as usual.

McKeever, a big horse for the third purse, was just tipped on for the first time, a 20 to 1 shot, and great the mourning threat. Granite, heavily played, was third.

Elected Two Ways by the Industrial Convention in St. Louis.

Threatened Splits on Prohibition and the Third Party Question.

St. Louis, Feb. 23.—"It has been said that Convention Day would be a Killenny fight." This was the fashion in which Chairman Connor today opened the big convention of the Industrial Union of Marine and Shipbuilding Workers of America.

Chairman Connor then raspingly proceeded, inviting any would-be leaders who were not present for harmonious action to get out of the way or be stepped upon.

He then announced that the Committee on Credentials had been in session practically all night, and would present a partial report. The report of the Credentials Committee recommended seating 240 delegates from the Farmers' Alliance, 53 F. M. B. A., 82 Knights of Labor, 97 National Farmers' Alliance, 25 National Citizens' Alliance, 97 Colored F. M. B. A., 27 National Citizens' Independent Alliance, 25 Patrons of Industry, 25 Patrons of Husbandry, total, 677.

The Farmers' Alliance was given 25 delegates-at-large and thirteen minor detached organizations and individual were given a representation of 58. The contest for the chairmanship was then opened.

Ignatius Donnelly moved an amendment to the effect that the chairmanship should be conferred on the man who had the most votes. The motion was seconded by George W. Wade, of the Dr. Wood Polk unopposed.

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
