AN ASTOR SCANDAL.

J. Coleman Drayton Challenges Hallett Borrowe to a Duel.

They Are Passengers on the Majestic, and May Fight at Sea.

Mrs. Drayton, Wife of the Challenger, Is William Astor's Daughter.

One of the most sensational domestic scandals ever known in New York fashionable society is brought to the fore. It involves the families of acknowledged society leaders of New York and Philadelphia, the Astors and the Draytons, and the members of Ward Melville's social circle.

The principal events which have led to the disclosure of the strained domestic relations of Mr. J. Coleman Drayton, who is the husband of Mrs. William Astor's third daughter, Augustus, transpired a few weeks ago on the other side of the Atlantic, and the news reached here in cable dispatches published in the "World."

The affair culminated in a challenge to a duel, issued by young Mr. Drayton to his former best friend and companion, Hallett Borrowe, son of Vice-President Samuel H. Borrowe, of the Equitable Life Assurance Society, whom he accuses of sustaining a false reputation for honor and respectability by his domestic life.

The duel was averted, after a prolonged negotiation between the seconds of the two principals, as a result of which Mr. Borrowe's representative declared that they could not allow him to fight Mr. Drayton, on the ground that the latter had forfeited all right to demand reparation for his injury through an appeal to arms, because he had allowed too long a time to elapse since the first cause of offense was given, and, further, because the injured party had accepted and enjoyed an annual monetary contribution as the price of his acquiescence in the matter.

By a strange coincidence both Mr. Drayton and Mr. Borrowe are passengers on the White Star liner Majestic, which sailed from Liverpool for this port last Wednesday. It is said that the men have been keeping watch on each other ever since the failure of the proceedings under the code, and that when Mr. Drayton took passage on the Majestic at Liverpool, Mr. Borrowe posted to Queenstown with Harry Van Miltz, one of his men, and boarded the steamship when she arrived there.

ALTHOUGH THE PAIR had been on intimate terms for many years, Mr. Drayton had never made any objection until a comparatively short time ago, when he complained to Mr. and Mrs. Astor that he was sick of Mr. Borrowe's attentions to their daughter, although Borrowe had always declared that his affection for Mrs. Drayton was purely platonic.
