WALL STREET, Tuesday, March 22.—The stock market was not particularly active today, but it took a decided course and invited trading by certain operators who have been holding off for some days.

Just before the close, Lake Shore and Michigan Central each reacted 2, but the general list closed within a fraction of the bid.

THOUSANDS MAY BE IDLE.

Walking Delegates Pushing the Strike on Contractor Downey.

They Claim They Can Stop All Work on the New Astor Hotels.

The fight between contractor John L. Downey, who is building the new Astor hotels, and the board of delegates of the building trades.

The painters, cornice and skylight makers and roofers on the Taylor building, at Fifty-first street and Broadway, one of contractor Downey's jobs, were ordered out this morning.

The strike of the building material handlers has apparently been the delegates' strongest card.

According to Mr. Downey this would add only about three hundred men to the number on hand, but the delegates assert that it would swell the number to 1,000.

The men now out include masons, carpenters, steam and gas fitters and helpers, cabinet-makers, wood-carvers, machine wood-workers, building material drivers, derrick-men, brown and red stone cutters, painters, cornice and skylight makers and roofers.

It is really against the Pelham Hotel-building company that this strike is directed, it is said.

After the settlement of the strike with Downey, the discharge of these engineers was demanded by the delegates.

STOPPED THE RACE TRACK.

The Park Board Recalls Its Order to Begin Work.

Mayor Grant Holds Up the Appropriation—Mass-Meeting Called.

A meeting of the Park Board was held this morning, at which the resolution directing that the race track be closed was reconsidered.

A preamble to the rescinding resolution stated that the action was taken for the purpose of giving a public hearing.

Mayor Grant, recognizing the weight of adverse popular opinion as expressed in the press has announced that he will advise the postponement of action by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment, which was to meet to-morrow for the purpose of making the appropriation of \$100,000 for the preliminary surveys and plans.

He has also requested the Park Board, which ordered the making of the surveys and plans, to accord a public hearing on the subject of the proposed alteration of the Park.

It is said he may find himself antipathized by a bill introduced by some Tammany Hall member having in view the same object.

CAPT. BAKKER CONVICTED.
