DRAYTON TO TALK

Closeted To-day With His Lawyer Preparing a Statement for the Public.

He Was Taken Off the Majestic by Dr. Jenkins and Slept at a Friend's House.

Mr. Borrowe Lands and Promises to Reply to Any Statement Drayton May Make Public.

The Stories About Mrs. Drayton, He Says, Are Cruel and Malicious Lies.

The only passenger of the steamship Majestic who was permitted to leave the ship before she arrived at her dock, at the foot of West Tenth street, this morning was J. Coleman Drayton, one of the principals in the Drayton-Borrowe scandal, which it had been feared would result in deadly combat in midocean.

Although neither the Collector of the Port nor anyone else in authority appears to have granted permission to Mr. Drayton to leave the vessel, by some means or other he made his way ashore before the Majestic left quarantine, and he has since kept himself in the closest hiding.

Whether he remained on Staten Island overnight, or came to New York and accepted the hospitality of friends here, or went on to Philadelphia, as some of his friends asserted he intended to do, could not be ascertained.

Those who had caught a glimpse of him on the Majestic as she came to anchor at Quarantine through the newspapers, and who had at that time, but although he refused them to talk of his difficulty with Mr. Borrowe, and of the scandal which his challenge to a duel had stirred up on both sides of the Atlantic, he promised to several persons that he would make an announcement in the evening, about 9 o'clock, he said, at the Windsor Hotel in this city, and make a full statement of his side of the case and answer all proper questions.

BLAND YIELDS TIME.

He Adds Three Hours to the Period of the Silver Bill.

Williams, of Illinois, the First Man to Speak To-day.

Says the Administration Would Work a Gold Premium Scare.

WASHINGTON, March 24.—The last legislative day of the silver debate opened with crowded galleries and a full attendance of members of the House.

Only the gentlemen who have been granted leave by the House were absent when the gavel fell.

Immediately after the reading of the journal the period of general debate was extended three hours by the announcement of Mr. Bland that he would postpone the motion for the adjournment until 5 o'clock in order to give opportunity for greater debate.

Representative Williams, of Illinois, a democratic member of the Committee on Coinage, opened the debate in favor of the bill. "I am in favor of sound currency," said he, "but one of sufficient volume to conduct with ease all the exchanges desired by the people. I believe that the volume of our money should increase as the volume of exchangeable products increases."

The speaker criticized the present Administration for working against the bill, and said that the Administration would work a gold premium scare.

WILL BUILD NO SPEEDWAY. WAR SHIPS IN BEHRING SEA.

The Park Commissioners So Decide This Afternoon. A Third Drive in the Park to Be at Once Reported On.

The Park Board at noon to-day had a meeting at which the Commissioners gave a supplementary hearing to the advocates of the speedway in Central Park.

Trading men agreed to a proposed amendment to the new law, which will provide for a third driveway on the west side of the Park from which bicyclists and equestrians shall be excluded, and on which the speed shall be no greater than it is at present.

The Commissioners, in executive session, resolved not to construct the speedway, Mr. Straus alone voting in the negative. The resolution is as follows:

Resolved, That the road contemplated be not constructed.

Another resolution directed the Superintendent of Parks and the Landscape Architect to report on the means for relieving the greater needs in the matter of driveways, at the next regular meeting of the Board.
