It was a slightly cynical, but a fairly good-humored crowd that had gathered before a warehouse on Long wharf in San Francisco one afternoon in the summer of '91. Although the occasion was an auction, the bidders' chances more than usually hazardous, and the season and locality famous for reckless speculation, there was scarcely any excitement among the bystanders, and a lazy, half-amused curiosity seemed to have taken the place of zeal for gain. In the majority of cases he never returned to claim his stored property.
