Superintendent of Police Murray is still ill and out of town. Chief Inspector Byrnes, who is acting superintendent during his absence, in response said to an EVENING WORLD reporter:

"I have read Mr. Taber's statement, but I don't see what I can do about it. I do not know the man, nor do I know that I have been bribed by him."

Such remarks and charges as are said to have been made by Mr. Taber with reference to the alleged corruption of the Police Department appear to be the utterances of a man who should be in an insane asylum, rather than in a Grand Jury room.

"If the Grand Jury and Mr. Taber obtained such testimony as he alleges that they heard, the proper thing for Mr. Taber to do was to witness it."

PARKHURST PAPERS SERVED.

His Men Got Liquor at Gabe Case's Places in the Park.

Two of Their Waiters Arrested and Held for Excise Violation.

Two of the three mysterious warrants issued by Police Justice Kilbrenn yesterday afternoon on the application of Agent Gardner, of Dr. Parkhurst's society, materialized this morning in the arraignment at Essex Market Police Court of two waiters charged with violating the Excise law.

The men were Oscar Wagner, of 308 Third Avenue, employed by Gabe Case in his central Park, Casino, and Julius Teller, of 212 East Seventy-third Street, one of the staff of waiters in McGowan's Pass Inn, also in Central Park.

Agent Gardner was the complainant, and he made out the case against Gabe Case and McGowan's waiters during Sunday afternoon last and was served with warrants in both places. He was accompanied by Frank Littlefield, a brother agent. The two prisoners were charged with being the waiters who served them with forbidden spirits.

The violation of law, to their minds, was so palpable that they deemed it advisable to secure warrants for the arrest of the two waiters and the managers of both establishments.

The three warrants issued by Justice Kilbrenn called for the apprehension of two John Doo and one Richard Roe, and were entrusted to the Court officers for execution.

The two waiters were found at the Excise office and were taken to Capt. Schmittberger's station-house in East Sixty-ninth Street.

The third warrant issued by Justice Kilbrenn was not executed, owing to the inability of the officers to locate the man.

At the station-house Teller was released on \$100 bail furnished by J. F. Sexton, one of the proprietors of the inn, but Wagner, who was unable to reach Gabe Case by messenger, had to spend the night in a cell.

Mr. Parkhurst was not present when the cases were called in Court; neither was Gabe Case, who is the proprietor of his waiter, was on hand to renew bail.
