DAILEY IS INDICTED.

FOR WIFE-POISONING.

The Grand Jury Finds a True Bill Against Dr. Buchanan.

Evidence of the Crime Unearthed by "World" Reporters.

The indictment charges Murder in the First Degree.

Dr. Robert W. Buchanan was this afternoon indicted for murder in the first degree for the alleged poisoning of his second wife, Mrs. Annie Brandon-Recker-Smith-Sutherland-Buchanan, on April 22 last, at their residence in West Eleventh street.

Buchanan was arraigned before Justice Martine in Part I. of the General Sessions yesterday and remanded for examination on the charge until 3 o'clock to-morrow afternoon. This examination will now be unnecessary, but when arraigned he may plead to the indictment. Dr. Buchanan is now confined in the Tombs.

His first witness who was examined in the afternoon was the doctor, and World reporters, through whose efforts he was arrested and indicted, have unearthed plenty of evidence which is estimated at from \$10,000 to \$15,000. She had been married several times before meeting Buchanan.

It was pretty clearly demonstrated that the second Mrs. Buchanan died from an overdose of poison. World reporters have also discovered that the first Mrs. Buchanan was in constant fear that he would poison her, and that when the doctor's second wife intimated that she was about to return to Newark and resume her old life she threatened that she should never go there.

"She is driving me crazy," the doctor is said to have remarked, "and I am going to dump her."

Mrs. Buchanan left a will bequeathing all her property to Dr. Buchanan, excepting \$50 each to her brother and sister.
