Supt. Byrnes Goes Over Them on the Witness Stand.

The Scene When Silney and Jim Lyons Were First Confronted.

Superintendent of Police Thomas Byrnes was the first witness to-day in the continued trial of Michael T. Silney for the murder of Bob Lyons, the Cherry street butcher...

Up to this point the witnesses examined had proven a strong case against "Jim" Lyons, Bob Lyons's brother, but had only generated an implication of Silney's guilt.

The Superintendent, however, testified to three confessions made by Silney, and the manner in which they were made.

In his first confession Silney said that he had himself killed Bob Lyons, but did it in self-defense, Bob having assaulted him for pressing him for payment of a bill.

Bob chased him around the market with a knife and he struck him with the cleaver because he feared for his life.

"How did Jim Lyons act when he listened to Silney's confession?" asked Mr. House.

"Silney stood up and pointing his finger at Lyons, said: 'You know you did it, Jim Lyons, and you know it better than I do.'"

"I did not, and that is a lie—you know it is, Mike," replied Lyons, calmly.

John F. Flinn, stenographer of the Police Department, the next witness, corroborated Supt. Byrnes, reading from his stenographic notes of the confession.

Detective Sergeants Crowley, Hanly and Heldelberger and Sgt. Mangin were in Lyons's clothes for indications that he had been dragged around on the butcher shop floor.

Mrs. Elizabeth Meyer, who lived next door to Lyons, testified that she saw Silney take her hat to the store which was written in his hand.

Russell Parker, of the firm that employed Silney, identified his handwriting on certain bills.

Daniel T. Ames, an expert in handwriting, testified that there could be no doubt that the red-inked decoy note was written by the same person that wrote Mikey's bills, letters and the like.

DR. BUCHANAN AT THE BAR.

The Alleged Wife-Poisoner, Called to Plead, Says "Not Guilty."
