Eight Indictments Against the Young Financier Dismissed.

The District-Attorney Agreed and Judge Cowing Acquiesced.

The eight indictments that have for three years been hanging over Henry S. Ives, the young Napoleon of Finance, who failed for \$1,000,000, were dismissed by Judge Cowing in the third of the court of general sessions today.

The District-Attorney offered no objection to dropping proceedings against the famous financier, and with the same lack of formality as a drunk or disorderly would be discharged, the greatest operator in the history of Wall Street was allowed to escape trial on charges of the most serious nature.

The eight indictments dismissed to-day were returned by the grand jury, as follows: Feb. 21, 1894, grand jury; Feb. 20, grand jury.
